From the Pastor,

This weekend is the Fourth Sunday of the Easter season, and the Gospels take a dramatic turn. In the first weeks of Easter the Gospels are all about events after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. But now our Gospels change and look at a series of stories of Jesus speaking with the disciples and apostles before his passion and death. These are all found in the Gospel of John.

These readings are from a rich and almost mystical part of John's Gospel. Jesus is at his best in talking about the relationship he has with the Father, and the relationship he has with us. He is getting his followers, his spiritual family, ready for his eventual departure from them physically in the coming Ascension. He is telling them, and us, that it is necessary for him to go away physically for us to realize that he is still here with us in so many ways spiritually. This is deep and rich time for the readings in the church.

Varias veces me han preguntado cómo podría la Iglesia católica de Idaho mejorar su misión de dar la bienvenida a las personas que llegan de otros países y que, en muchos casos, son miembros de la Iglesia católica. Acabo de encontrar estas sugerencias prácticas en una carta pastoral escrita por los obispos del sur de Chile y de la Patagonia, publicadas por ZENIT.org, el pasado 5 de abril:

Reunidos en Valdivia (Chile), del 1 al 4 de abril, los Obispos del sur de Chile y de la Patagonia hemos reflexionado y compartido -en un ambiente de fraternidad y comunión eclesial- sobre distintos temas que desafían nuestra acción pastoral. Hemos recibido el aporte de expertos que nos han transmitido datos y tendencias de la realidad para proyectar allí la luz que viene del Evangelio y del Magisterio de la Iglesia, en especial del Documento de Aparecida.

### 1. MIGRACIONES

Nos proponemos desarrollar algunas acciones pastorales en nuestras Iglesias particulares, según las posibilidades. Ellas son:

- A) Fortalecer las Comisiones de Pastoral Migratoria, en los lugares donde las hay, y crearlas donde no existen.
- B) Establecer un puente entre la Iglesia que recibe al migrante y aquella de donde proviene.
- C) Motivar y formar al personal consagrado y agentes laicos de pastoral en el tema de la movilidad humana, que es un signo de los tiempos.
- D) Establecer formas concretas de acogida en cada Diócesis, como por ejemplo un lugar de culto, una oficina y personal que atienda a quienes han venido de otras partes.
- E) Favorecer la promoción humana integral de los migrantes, lo que implica tutelar su dignidad y sus derechos, el ejercicio de la solidaridad y de la subsidiariedad, atendiendo por ejemplo, la situación de los indocumentados.
- F) Promover la evangelización de los migrantes que implica acoger su religiosidad, valorarla y acompañarla, junto con ofrecer instancias de catequesis, formación y espiritualidad, para que ellos mismos se conviertan en discípulos y misioneros de Jesucristo.
- G) Animar la inculturación, ayudando a valorar la cultura del lugar a donde se llega, sin perder su identidad de origen.

Les ofrezco como una invitación a reflexionar sobre cómo seguir respondiendo a nuestra misión como Iglesia: "la Casa de Dios es su casa".

I have been asked on several occasions on how the Catholic Church in Idaho can improve their mission on welcoming people who come from different countries and who, in many cases, are members of the Catholic Church. I have just found these practical suggestions in a pastoral letter written by the bishops of South Chile and of Patagonia, published by ZENIT.org, on April 5th :

A meeting in Valdivia (Chile), from April 1 to April 4, where the Bishops from South of Chile and Patagonia have reflected on and shared – in an environment of fraternity and ecclesial communion – different topics which challenge our pastoral mission. We have received support from the experts who provide data and trends of the reality where we can shine the light of the Gospel and the official teaching of the Church, especially in the Document of Aparecida (Brazil).

### Migrations

We propose to develop some pastoral action plans in each of our dioceses according to some of the possibilities which are listed below:

Foster the commission of the Pastoral Migration and Refugees wherever this is in place and create a commission where there is no existence of this ministry.

Establish a bridge between the Church where the Migrants are coming from and the Church where they are going to. Motivate and form a devoted personnel and pastoral lay agents to deal with human migration which is the sign of our times.

Establish concrete forms for welcoming in each diocese, for example a place of worship, an office and personnel who take care of the needs of those who come from other countries.

Foster the integral education of the migrants and their dignity, rights, solidarity, subsidiary and attending to the needs of those that are undocumented.

Foster the evangelization of the migrants which includes welcoming their popular religiosity; valuing it and accompanying it by means of offering catechetical formation and spirituality so that they themselves can become disciples and missionaries of Jesus Christ.

Promote enculturation by helping them valuing the culture of the place they have come to without losing the identity of the place they have come from.

I invite you to reflect on how we can keep responding to our mission as a Church: "The House of God is Your House".
