Hace varios años fui invitado a dirigir un retiro con el título de "El Sanador Lastimado". Se refiere a Jesucristo, quien siendo nuestro sanador, fue lastimado por nuestros pecados. Pero Jesús mismo aceptó esto por amor a la humanidad. Aceptó sufrir lo que sufre todo ser humano. Hizo suyas nuestras debilidades. En una palabra, el Dios Todopoderoso se hizo vulnerable. Me vino esto a la memoria ayer que fui al hospital a visitar al Padre Faucher. Nuestro pastor está lastimado y experimentando la debilidad de su enfermedad. Un hombre a quien normalmente vemos tan seguro de sí mismo, hoy necesita de nuestro apoyo. Todos los seres humanos somos vulnerables, aunque no todas las personas aceptan esa limitación de su ser. El aceptar nuestra vulnerabilidad es una actitud saludable y tiene por lo menos dos ventajas. La primera consiste en que nos mueve en la dirección de buscar algo sólido, algo firme, algo invulnerable. Esto nos puede llevar directamente a buscar nuestro apoyo en Dios; es decir, puede despertar en nosotros una fuerte espiritualidad de absoluta confianza en Dios. La segunda consiste en que cuando uno ha experimentado una debilidad: sea una enfermedad, un accidente, un error, etc., se coloca uno en una mejor perspectiva para entender a la persona que está pasando por lo mismo. Es lo que podemos llamar empatía y compasión. Esto lo integramos a nuestra fe y lo celebramos al comienzo de la Misa cuando todos y cada uno de nosotros nos declaramos públicamente pecadores: "Yo confieso ante Dios y ante ustedes, hermanos/as, que he pecado..." En alta teología llamamos a esto el misterio de la Encarnación, cuando Dios mismo aceptó hacerse uno de nosotros en todo, menos en el pecado. Por eso Jesucristo no se avergüenza de llamarnos hermanos/as. Ahora que el Padre Faucher está recuperándose de su cirugía, pensemos en que, como ser humano, necesita nuestro apoyo, nuestra oración, nuestro afecto, nuestra atención. Dice la regla de oro: "Hagamos a otros lo que queramos para nosotros mismos". Desde estas líneas le deseamos a nuestro párroco una pronta recuperación.

Several years ago I was invited to lead a retreat titled "The wounded healer." It refers to Jesus Christ as our healer, who was wounded for our sins. But Jesus himself accepted this for the love of humanity. He accepted the suffering that all humans suffer. He made our sufferings his own. In other words, God all powerful made himself vulnerable. This came to me yesterday when I visited Fr. Faucher. Our pastor is wounded and experiencing the weakness of his illness. A man whom we normally see as a confident man now needs our support. As human beings we are vulnerable even though we don't all accept this weakness. Accepting our vulnerability is a healthy attitude and it allows for at least two advantages. The first consists of moving us toward finding something solid, something firm, something invulnerable. This could lead us directly to finding support from God; it is to say, it may awake in us a strong spirituality of absolute confidence in God. The second consists of when one has experienced a weakness: An illness, an accident, a mistake, etc.; it places us in a better place to understand other people who are going through the same situation. This is what we can call empathy and compassion. We integrate this with our faith and we celebrate it at the beginning of Mass when all of us and each one of us declares publicly that we are sinners: I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned..." In high theology, we have called this the ministry of Incarnation, when God himself accepted the responsibility of becoming one of us in everything except sin. This is why Jesus Christ was not embarrassed to call us brothers and sisters. Now that Fr. Faucher is recuperating from his surgery, as a human being, he needs our support, prayers, affection and our attention. The Golden Rule says: Let us do unto others as we want others to do unto us". Via this message we wish our pastor a speedy recovery.
