El 1 de mayo celebramos la fiesta de San José Obrero, instituida por el Papa Pío XII el 1 de mayo de 1955 para que, "el humilde obrero de Nazaret, además de encarnar delante de Dios y de la Iglesia la dignidad del obrero manual, sea también el diligente guardián de ustedes y de su familia". San José no es alguien que se impone a primera vista. Sólo se le descubre poco a poco. Cuando se entra en la lógica de Dios, el alma de José resulta transparente: en lo ordinario y en lo extraordinario. Hombre de lo extraordinario, José creyó —y con qué fe sencilla y profunda a la vez en sus "sueños". Algo no tan evidente. Sufrió al tener que llevar a su esposa a un establo para dar a luz a su Hijo. Pero José es sobre todo el hombre de lo ordinario, de la vida monótona en que, al parecer, no pasa nada. Monotonía de ir educando a ese Hijo misterioso, tan parecido a los demás. Monotonía de iniciar a Jesús en el oficio de trabajar la madera. Monotonía de los gestos de cada día. Monotonía que nunca es rutina porque nace del amor. Monotonía abierta a la admiración al ver vivir, evolucionar, "crecer en sabiduría, edad y gracia" no sólo a Jesús sino también a su hermosa y limpia María. San José, patrono de los trabajadores: "Oh José, tú que sufriste el peso del cansancio y la fatiga para procurar el sustento de Jesús y María, protege nuestro trabajo, aleja todo peligro; no permitas que nos falte el medio de alimentar dignamente a la familia. Alivia la angustia de los desempleados y la ansiedad de los inmigrantes; haz que en el respeto a los derechos y en la dignidad del trabajo podamos imitar con tu ejemplo en nuestra vida los designios ocultos que Dios nos ha reservado" (oración compuesta por el Papa Juan XXIII).
