From the Pastor,

Last weekend at all of the Masses the priests read a note confirming that we will begin construction of the new church in January. There are a number of steps we need to take care for that to happen, specifically getting all of the plans through the city and the diocese, but that all looks like it will take place without difficulty.

We also mentioned that we will have a fund drive in October and November to get the rest of the money so that when the church is finished in December of 2007, we would be out of debt. One aspect of that fund drive is to contact the families of St. Mary's parishioners of the past. Some of these are in my generation and some before and after my time.

What we intend to do is contact the children of these families and ask for a gift in honor of their parents and family. My family is already doing this both for the Faucher's and for my sister-in-law's family. What we need are the contact persons for these old families.

If you can think of some of the great old Saint Mary's families who should be honored as we renew our church, please write or call the office with the name and if possible the person we can get in touch with to ask for a gift. I can think of more than a dozen from my era where the children have scattered throughout the country. We will write them and ask that they make a gift so their family name will be remembered in a memorial plaque. Those children who still live in Boise will be personally visited.

Throughout its 70 years Saint Mary's has always been known as a family parish. That tradition needs to be both honored and continued. Please help by sending in the names of the old families and the person we should contact. Thank you for your help.
