4 de agosto: San Juan María Vianney, Cura de Ars (Francia). Nació en Dardilly, cerca de Lyon, Francia, el 8 de mayo de 1786. Murió en Ars el 4 de agosto de 1859 (hace 150 años). A pesar de sus limitadas facultades intelectuales, fue ordenado sacerdote el 13 de agosto de 1815. En 1818, fue nombrado párroco de Ars. Algunos años después de su llegada a esa parroquia fundó una especie de orfanato para jóvenes desamparadas. Pero la principal labor del Cura de Ars fue la dirección espiritual. La gente empezó a acudir de otras parroquias; luego de todas partes de Francia; y después, de otros países. Durante los últimos diez años de vida, pasaba de dieciséis a dieciocho horas diarias en el confesionario. Su consejo era buscado por obispos, sacerdotes, religiosos, jóvenes, mujeres, pecadores, personas con toda

clase de dificultades y enfermos. Su dirección espiritual se caracterizaba por el sentido común, su notable perspicacia y por su conocimiento sobrenatural. A veces adivinaba pecados no revelados en una confesión imperfecta. Sus enseñanzas y predicaciones las daba en lenguaje sencillo, lleno de imágenes sacadas de la vida diaria, pero que respiraban fe y amor a Dios. Los milagros registrados por sus biógrafos son de tres clases: a) en primer lugar, la obtención de dinero para sus limosnas y alimento para sus huérfanos; b) en segundo lugar, conocimiento sobrenatural del pasado y del futuro; y c) en tercer lugar, curación de enfermos, especialmente niños. Pero el mayor milagro de todos fue su propia vida. Practicó la mortificación desde su juventud; y durante cuarenta años su alimentación y descanso eran insuficientes, humanamente hablando, para mantener su vida. Y así vivió hasta los setenta y tres años. El 8 de enero de 1905 fue declarado Beato; y el Papa Pío X lo propuso como modelo para el clero parroquial. El Papa Pío XI lo canonizó en 1925. Con motivo del 150o. aniversario de su muerte, el Papa Benedicto XVI ha convocado un "Año Sacerdotal", al final del cual va a proclamar al santo cura de Ars "patrono de todos los sacerdotes del mundo".

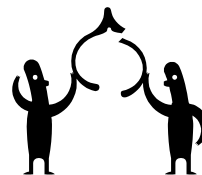
### FOOD BANK WISH LIST
