The groundbreaking this Saturday is the fifth time I have been pastor of a parish as it goes through the rigors of construction. I have also been involved, as designer and consultant, with almost a dozen other churches as they have gone through this. The next 18 months will be a difficult time for all of us.

I am excited about what we are doing, but I already wish the construction was done. It takes a lot to constantly adjust to something new and construction is always something new. There will be weeks when it looks like nothing has happened, and then days when all sorts of changes appear. There will be dust and noise when we don't want them.

But what we are doing is worth all of that. In the end we will have a bigger, more usable, but still the old St. Mary's church.

One thing I ask is that when you see one of the workers on the church, say "hello." Thank them for the work they are doing for us. They will be here for 18 months of their lives -- let's make sure it is one of the most pleasant 18 months they have ever spent.

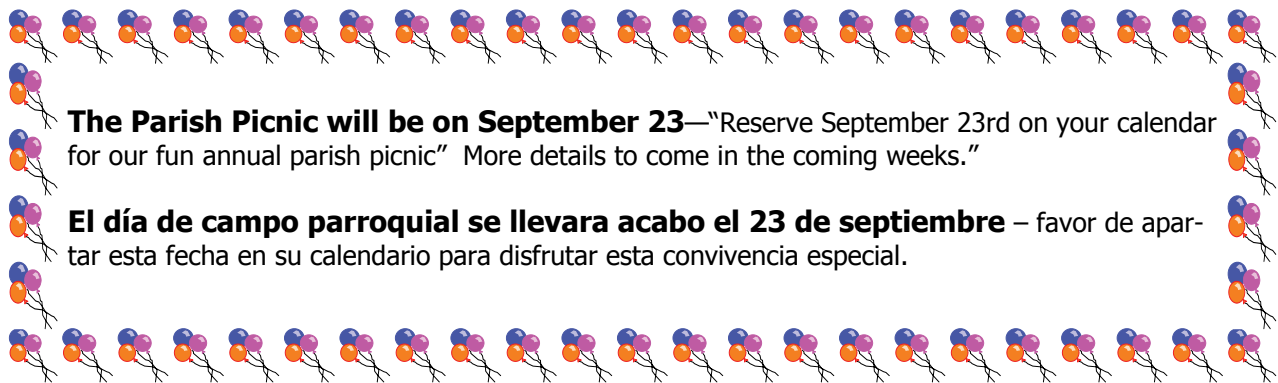

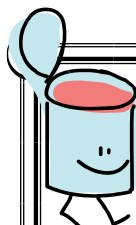
