FROM THE PASTOR

Today I would like to share where we are financially on our building projects. Later on in the fall we will have the full report on parish finances for fiscal year 2004/2005.

We are working simultaneously on two projects. The First Project is the renovation of the buildings at 26th and State Street. This is planned to be done in two different stages. Stage one of this project is the renovation and expansion of our church building. Stage two is the renovation of our old school building. At first the new vestibule or lobby was planned to be part of the first stage but we have discovered that it has to be part of the second stage.

The Second Project is the building of a new Saint Mary's School on land presently occupied by a Nazarene Church and a small farm on Castle Drive. This also will be done in two stages.

The first stage is the acquisition of the land. We intend to buy the farm outright and do a "turn-key" operation for the Nazarene Church land. In a "turn-key" operation we will build the Nazarenes a new church building on new land and then trade the new building and land for their old building and land.

The second stage of the school project would be the building of the new school on the land on Castle Drive.

PROJECT ONE -- THE LAND AT 26TH AND STATE STREETS

It is now estimated that the renovation of the church will cost approximately \$2.6 million dollars. This is the first stage of Project One. The second stage of Project One, the building of the vestibule and the renovation of the old school building into a parish hall and adult education center, will cost approximately \$1.5 million dollars. We had a Fund Drive for the church and have so far received pledges of \$1.1 million. The pledge money is coming in very well and so far we have received over \$200,000 of the pledged \$1.1 million.

The parish now has five saving accounts. Two of these, the General fund and the Miller Account, are for parish needs and are not involved with our building plans. There is the old church/school building fund account which holds the money from the land the parish used to own on Gary Lane [approximately \$1 million] and the money from the sale of the land at 27th and State earlier this year [approximately \$350,000]. There is a new church building fund into which we put the money from the pledges and any other donations we receive now. That has approximately \$200,000 in it but will eventually have the entire \$1.1 pledged money. There is a new school building fund which has about \$7,500 in it.

Since the land on Gary Lane and the land at 27th and State were both parcels owned by the church but deeply involved with the school, the \$1.3 in the old church/school building fund is intended to supply money for both the church project and the school project. Thus there will be approximately \$650,000 from that fund which will be used for Project One, the renovation and expansion of the church.

Thus where we stand now on Project One, renovating and expanding the church, is that we have \$650,000 in old savings, \$200,000 in new savings, and pledges of about \$900,000 yet to come in. If we received all of that we would have \$1.75 million. But Project One's first stage is set to cost about \$2.6 million. We are still short about a million dollars. We could take out a loan for part of the deficit, but I am very reluctant to put the parish in debt. It would be very hard for us to pay off a debt using our regular income.

Later on this month we will have a meeting of parish leaders to figure out how we are going to acquire the million dollars we need to renovate the church.

The second stage of the Project One, the vestibule and renovation of the old school will be the last thing we do and that is probably a long way off.

PROJECT TWO -- THE SCHOOL ON CASTLE DRIVE

Stage One of the second project is the acquisition of the land on Castle Drive. Between buying the small farm and the "turn-key" operation with the Nazarene Church, this will cost \$2.25 million. This divides into a total of \$2 million for all aspects of the Nazarene Church "turn-key," and \$250,000 for the small farm. We have already purchased five acres on land on Bogart Lane where the new Nazarene Church will be built. The money for this, approximately \$300,000, was taken from the old church/school building fund. We also bought and moved the old Parma Church which will be placed on the new school site. This cost is approximately \$50,000. We may have to spend approximately \$90,000 in architects fees

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for the Nazarene Church later this year. And we are scheduled to pay the \$250,000 for the small farm later this year. Both of these amounts will come out of the old church/school building fund. When this is done it uses up all of the school's part of the old church/school building fund.

We then need to obtain about \$1.6 million so we can build the new Nazarene Church and complete the "turn-key." When we are finished with that, we can turn our minds to the approximately \$5 million it will cost to build the new school.

Later on this month there will be a meeting of parish and school leaders to figure out how we are going to acquire the \$1.6 million to become owners of the land and complete the first stage of Project Two.

CONCLUSION

We are looking at building expenses of about \$11 million for the four stages of the two projects. We have spent or soon will spend about \$600,000 of this so far, \$550,000 of which is really trading one asset or another. We had cash, now we own, according to our realtor, very valuable, property. We have cash on hand after we spend what is planned about \$800,000.

I know this all sounds overwhelming but I am not discouraged. Saint Mary's is not a rich parish, but is a solid community of faith. We have constantly prayed that everything we do is God's will, and I truly believe God has guided us to be where we are. God's inspiration and our hard work will supply the amount we need.

We need to have everyone complete their pledges and then we need one more million for the church, and we need \$1.6 million for the school land. I have no doubt that God, the Blessed Virgin [and one of my favorite saints, Saint Winefride] will make it happen soon.

Hoy les quisiera compartir nuestra situación económica en relación con nuestros proyectos de construcción. Mas adelante en el otoño vamos a tener un reporte complete sobre las finanzas parroquiales del año fiscal 2004/2005.

Estamos trabajando en dos proyectos simultáneamente. El Primer Proyecto es la renovación de los edificios ubicados entre las calles 26 y State. Pensamos desarrollar este proyecto en dos etapas. La primera etapa, es la renovación y ampliación de nuestra iglesia. La segunda etapa, es la renovación del edificio de nuestra escuela. El nuevo vestíbulo o sala de espera estaba planeado para la primera etapa pero hemos descubierto que tiene que ser parte de la segunda etapa. El Segundo proyecto es la construcción de la nueva escuela de Santa María en el terreno en donde se encuentra una iglesia Nazarene y una granja en la calle Castle Drive. Esto también se hará en dos etapas. La primera etapa es la compra del terreno. Intentamos comprar toda la granja y después hacer un "intercambio". Es decir, una operación que a cambio del terreno, nosotros fincaremos una iglesia nueva para los Nazarenos y después intercambiamos el nuevo edificio y terreno por el edificio actual y terreno. La segunda etapa del proyecto de la escuela es de fincar una nueva escuela ubicada en la calle Castle Drive.

PRIMER PROYECTO – EL TERRENO EN LAS CALLES 26 Y STATE

El costo de la renovación de la iglesia es aproximadamente de \$2.6 millones de dólares. Esta es la primera etapa del Primer Proyecto. La segunda etapa del Primer Proyecto es la construcción del vestíbulo y la renovación del edificio de la escuela Antigua para convertir la en un centro parroquial y centro de educación de Adultos. Va a costar aproximadamente \$1.5 millones de dólares. Tuvimos una campaña para recaudar fondos para reconstruir la iglesia y hasta ahorita se han recibido promesas de \$1.1 millón. El dinero de estas promesas se está recibiendo y hasta ahorita hemos recibido más de \$200,000 de los \$1.1 millón comprometido a la parroquia. La parroquia tiene cinco cuentas de ahorros. Dos de estas cuentas, la cuenta General y la cuenta "Miller" son para las necesidades parroquiales y no se incluyen en los planes de la construcción. También hay una cuenta que se llama "Fondos de los Edificios Antiguos: Iglesia/Escuela con el dinero de la venta del terreno que le pertenecía a la parroquia anteriormente ubicada en la calle Gary y el terreno ubicado en las calles 27 y State (aproximadamente \$350,000). Ahora hay una nueva cuenta para los fondos de la nueva iglesia en donde depositamos el dinero comprometido a la parroquia y el dinero de otras donaciones que recibimos. Esta cuenta tiene aproximadamente \$200,000 pero esperamos que tenga el dinero comprometido de 1.1 millón que se prometió. Hay una cuenta nueva con fondos para la nueva escuela que tiñe como \$7,500. Como los terrenos ubicado en las calles Gary y 27 y State fueron propiedades de la iglesia pero fueron una gran parte de la escuela, el \$1.3 millón de dólares en la cuenta de los edificios antiguos de la iglesia/escuela está apartado para distribuir el dinero entre el proyecto de la iglesia y el de la escuela. Así habrá aproximadamente \$650,000 en esta cuenta, que se usará para el Primer Proyecto: La renovación y ampliación de la iglesia. Finalmente, nuestra realidad en el Primer

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Proyecto es de que tenemos \$650,000 en la cuenta de ahorros antigua, \$200,000 en nuestra cuenta de ahorros nueva y promesas de \$900,000 que todavía faltan si recibimos todo el dinero prometido, tendríamos \$1.75 millones. Pero la primera fase del Primer Proyecto costará aproximadamente \$2.6 millones. Todavía nos falta un millón de dólares. Pudiéramos pedir un préstamo para completar esa cantidad, pero no quisiera que la parroquia se endeudara más. Sería muy difícil pagar esta deuda con los ingresos que recibimos regularmente. Más adelante en este mes tendremos una junta con los líderes de la parroquia para determinar cómo vamos a conseguir los millones de dólares que necesitamos para renovar la iglesia. La segunda etapa del Primer Proyecto: El vestíbulo y la renovación de la escuela Antigua, que va hacer la última cosa que haremos, aunque no muy pronto.

SEGUNDO PROYECTO – LA ESCUELA UBICADA EN LA CALLE CASTLE DRIVE

La primera etapa del Segundo proyecto es la compra del terreno en la calle Castle Drive. Comprando la pequeña granjea y la operación "intercambio" con la iglesia Nazarena. Esto costará \$2.25 millones. Estos \$2 millones se reparten entre el intercambio con la iglesia Nazarena y \$250,000 para la pequeña granjea. Ya pagamos los 5 acres en la calle Bogart donde se fincará la nueva iglesia del Nazareno. El dinero que se usó para esta operación que fue aproximadamente de \$300,000, se tomó de la cuenta de los edificios antiguos de la iglesia/escuela. También compramos y mudamos la Antigua iglesia de Parma que se pondrá en el nuevo sitio de la escuela. Costó aproximadamente \$50,000. Probablemente vamos a gastar aproximadamente \$90,000 en pagos de arquitectos por la construcción de la iglesia. Esta planeado pagar los \$250,000 por la pequeña granjea este año. Estas dos cantidades se retirarán de la cuenta de los edificios antiguos de la iglesia/escuela. Cuando se complete esta operación se usarán todos los fondos que le pertenecen a la escuela. Además necesitamos \$1.6 millones para fincar la nueva iglesia del Nazareno y completar el intercambio. Cuando hayamos terminado esto, podemos concentrarnos en los \$5 millones de dólares que costará la construcción de la nueva escuela. Más adelante se llevará a cabo una junta con líderes de la escuela y la parroquia para determinar como es de que vamos a conseguir los \$1.6 millones para comprar el terreno y completar la primera etapa del Segundo Proyecto.

CONCLUSIÓN

Tenemos gastos de aproximadamente \$11 millones por las cuatro etapas de estos dos proyectos. Hemos gastado o ya pronto gastaremos aproximadamente \$600,000. \$550,00 en realidad es el intercambio de una cosa por otra. Teníamos dinero pero ahora, como dice nuestro agente de bienes y raíces, tenemos una propiedad muy valiosa. El dinero que nos queda después de los gastos es aproximadamente \$800,000.

Ya se que todo esto suena como mucha información pero no estoy desamparado. Santa María no es una parroquia con mucho dinero, pero si es una parroquia con mucha comunidad y fe. Hemos rezado que todo lo que hagamos sea la voluntad de Dios, y sinceramente pienso de que Dios nos ha guiado hasta aquí. La inspiración de Dios y nuestro trabajo no va a proveer la cantidad necesaria.

Necesitamos que todos cumplan con sus promesas y después necesitamos \$1 millón de dólares más para la iglesia, y necesitamos \$1.6 millones más para la propiedad de la escuela. No tengo ninguna duda de que Dios, la Virgen María (y una de mis santas favoritas – Sta. Winefride) nos van a lograr este favor pronto.
