The following was sent to me from an old and dear friend.

Life is a Gift of Abundance

There was a blind girl who hated herself because she was blind. She hated everyone, except her loving boyfriend. He was always there for her. She told her boyfriend, 'If I could only see the world, I will marry you.'

One day, someone donated a pair of eyes to her. When the bandages came off, she was able to see everything, including her boyfriend.

He asked her, 'Now that you can see the world, will you marry me?' The girl looked at her boyfriend and saw that he was blind. The sight of his closed eyelids shocked her. She hadn't expected that. The thought of looking at them the rest of her life led her to refuse to marry him.

Her boyfriend left in tears and days later wrote a note to her saying: 'Take good care of your eyes, my dear, for before they were yours, they were mine.'

This is how the human brain often works when our status changes. Only a very few remember what life was like before, and who was always by their side in the most painful situations.

- Today before you say an unkind word - Think of someone who can't speak.
- Before you complain about the taste of your food - Think of someone who has nothing to eat.
- Before you complain about your husband or wife - Think of someone who's crying out to GOD for a companion.
- Today before you complain about life - Think of someone who went too early to heaven; Before you complain about your children - Think of someone who desires children but they're barren.
- Before you argue about your dirty house someone didn't clean or sweep - Think of the people who are living in the streets.
- Before whining about the distance you drive - Think of someone who walks the same distance with their feet.
- And when you are tired and complain about your job - Think of the unemployed, the disabled, and those who wish they had your job.
- But before you think of pointing the finger or condemning another - Remember that not one of us is without sin.
- And when depressing thoughts seem to get you down - Put a smile on your face and think: you're alive and still around.

deacons. When Lawrence sensed that danger was nearby, he collected all of the money and treasures that the Roman Church had and he divided it up among the poor. He sold the gold chalices, seborium and valuable candle holders and he divided the money among the most in need. The Roman Mayor asked Lawrence to gather and take all of the church's treasures. Lawrence lined up all of the poor people, crippled, orphaned, widowed, mutilated, blind and lepers. He called for the Mayor and said I have gathered all the treasures of the church, I assure you that they are more valuable than those that are possessed by the emperor. When the Mayor arrived, he was greatly disturbed. Lawrence asked, "Why are you so disturbed? These are the most valued treasures of the church." The mayor was so outraged that he ordered Lawrence to be burned to death on a grid iron. St Augustine tells us that the deacon's desire to be with Christ was so great that he minimized the importance of the torturous pain with tranquility that was never seen before. Lawrence prayed for the conversion of Rome and the spreading of the evangelization of Christ throughout the world when he exhaled his last breath. It was the 10th of August in the year 258. The Poet Prudentius says that the martyrdom of Lawrence served as a tool for converting Rome because this man's valor converted senators and from that day forward idolatry became less in the city. I extend my sincere blessings to our deacons on the feast day of their patron saint.
