### PASTORS' PAGE

From the Pastor,

We begin this weekend with a series of Gospel readings that lead us into the Gospel of St. Luke. Having said that, the first reading is out of place and comes from the Gospel of St. John. But it does set the tone for the involvement of Jesus in the lives of the people. Until Ash Wednesday we will hear of Jesus getting started in Galilee and then forming his first group of followers, those who will become the apostles.

Luke wrote his Gospel to tell the Romans what Jesus was like. He wrote to tell them that Jesus was both the fulfillment of Jewish prophecy but also a savior for all people. His is the most open ended of the Gospel stories and the one with the most personal detail.

It is important to remember that Luke probably never met Jesus. He, like us, had to go on the information given him by other people. I think that is why I like Luke the best of the Gospels. He is the most interested in the people Jesus meets.

For followers of Jesus Christ everything is about relationships. This is not only our relationship with Jesus, but our relationships with each other. God deals with us always as individuals in the midst of a community. If we skip the community part we are not really part of Jesus at all.

It would be good for all of us to take an hour or so, sit down, and just read the entire Gospel of Luke. It will make the next weeks at Mass be much more meaningful.

Es una buena oportunidad para recordar que actualmente la Iglesia Católica defiende públicamente los derechos de los inmigrantes, sobre todo de los indocumentados. Voy a citar un párrafo, a manera de ejemplo: "Los más de once millones de inmigrantes indocumentados que residen actualmente en Estados Unidos son motivo de especial preocupación para la Iglesia y la sociedad en general. Las personas indocumentadas son particularmente vulnerables a la explotación de los empleadores y no pueden buscar reparación por temor a ser descubiertas y deportadas. La Iglesia ha enseñado históricamente que la falta del debido status legal nunca debe privar a las personas de su derecho, dado por Dios, a ser tratadas justa y humanamente en consonancia con el derecho internacional. La presencia de gran número de personas viviendo en las sombras de la sociedad sin poder recurrir a protecciones legales fundamentales es una grave injusticia que la Iglesia busca remediar". Tomorrow is a holiday for the whole country to honor Martin Luther King Jr. who fought for the civil rights of the African American People. This fight led to his death. It is a good opportunity to remember that presently the Catholic Church publicly defends the rights of immigrant's and in particular undocumented immigrants. I will cite a paragraph as a matter of example: "The more than 11 million undocumented immigrants who currently reside in the United States is motive enough for church and society to be especially concerned. Undocumented persons are particularly vulnerable to the exploitation of employers and they are unable to seek help for fear of being discovered and then deported. The church has historically shown that legal status does not deprive a person of their rights, given by God, to be treated justly and humanly in accordance with the international laws. The presence of such a large number of persons living in the shadows of society without being able to receive fundamental legal protection is a grave injustice that the church seeks to remedy."
