### PASTORS' PAGE

I want to apologize for not being at the 8:30 Mass last Sunday. I was not feeling at all good, but the main reason was that in my not feeling good I had looked at the schedule and simply looked at the wrong weekend. I thank our deacon Bill Petzak for taking care of things so well.

I am very pleased at this time to announce a change in our parish staff organization. Last year we hired Nancy Krueger to be the Business Manager of the parish. She has done this extremely well and has helped in the reorganization of the way the parish functions as well as how the school functions. We hired first Dawn Teply and now Bob Chapman as the Business Manager of the school. All of these great people have done excellent work and I thank them very much.

I am pleased to say that now we are going to improve even a little bit more. Beginning February 1, 2006, John Krueger will assume the role of Parish Manager. Nancy will stay on staff as the bookkeeper for the parish. This will not cause us an increase in salary. John, who retired this month from his management position at Key Bank, will oversee all aspects of the parish business and financial affairs and work with the new School Governing Board and with Bob Chapman, the School Business Manager, to oversee all aspects of the school.

I welcome John Krueger to the parish staff and am excited about being able to work more closely with him. At the same time I am very pleased that Nancy Krueger, who is married to John, has chosen to stay on the staff. Our parish staff is a truly outstanding group of people and that makes my job, especially while I am on this partial medical leave, much easier.

On a different subject, many of you have noticed that the new pulpit (lectern) for the renovated church has arrived from England. The tradition of having an eagle lectern is an old and revered one in the church. I found this lectern at a used church warehouse near London. Don't worry about how tall it is. It will either be shortened or placed on a lower step when it is installed in the new sanctuary.

There is an inscription around the bottom of it which reads: All Saints Church Salterhebble A Thank-offering from two parishioners Christmas 1876.

Salterhebble is a village in West Yorkshire. All Saints Church has a website and describes itself as an evangelical Anglican Church which recently underwent a big renovation. Part of what they did was to modernize all their sanctuary furniture. An "evangelical" Anglican church is the branch of the church which is much closer to Protestantism than to Catholicism. It must be at that time that they sold the lectern which we eventually bought. I have written to them to tell them what happened to it.

Volvemos al tiempo ordinario, litúrgicamente hablando. Una vez transcurridas las fiestas del ciclo navideño, la Iglesia nos propone un tiempo para revisar y meditar las verdades esenciales de nuestra fe.

Invito a las personas que hicieron el propósito de “acercarse más a Dios” en este año, que aprovechen las oportunidades que les ofrece su iglesia. Voy a mencionar algunas: primero que todo, les recomiendo la misa dominical. El domingo es el día en que la iglesia alimenta la fe de sus hijos/as con doble comida: la Palabra y el Pan de Dios. Que su semana gire alrededor del domingo. Primero asegure la asistencia a Misa, después lo demás. Si es necesario, revise sus horarios de trabajo. Otra sugerencia: reciba la Sagrada Comunión cada domingo (si necesita recibir el sacramento del perdón, hágalo). Otra más: ponga en orden su vida espiritual; si usted no está casado/a por la Iglesia no olvide que su matrimonio no es agradable a Dios; si usted es mayor de 16 años y no está confirmado/a, haga lo posible por inscribirse en el curso de preparación (que empezará a mediados de febrero); si usted piensa bautizar a su hijo/a, o celebrar los 15 años de su hija, o los invitan a ser padrinos, tomen en serio las pláticas de preparación. Piense también en la posibilidad de acudir al estudio de la Biblia cada semana.

Finalmente, si desea colaborar en los servicios que se prestan a la comunidad parroquial, regale una o dos horas a la semana a su iglesia, en lo que usted guste y quiera.

We have returned to ordinary time, liturgically speaking. Once the Christmas feast cycle has passed, the Church proposes a time to evaluate and meditate on the essential truths of our faith.

I invite the people who made the commitment to become closer to God this year to make use of the opportunities that His church offers them. I would like to point out a few of these opportunities: first I recommend attending Sunday Mass. Sunday is the day in which the church feeds the faith of its children with a double meal: the Word of God and the Body of Christ. Center your week around Sunday. First ensure attendance at Mass and the rest will follow. If necessary revise your work schedules. Another suggestion: receive Holy Communion every Sunday (if you need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, do so). One more suggestion: put your spiritual life in order; if you are not married / married in the Church, do not forget that this state is not agreeable to God; if you are a minor of 16 years and are not confirmed, do all that is possible to register in Confirmation classes, which will begin in the middle of February; if you plan to have a child baptized or to celebrate your daughter's 15th year, or if you are invited to be godparents, take the preparation classes seriously. Also consider attending Bible study every week.

Finally, if you would like to participate in the services that contribute to the parish community, consider using your talents to give one or two hours a week to the church.
