**FROM THE PASTOR,**

I had an interesting challenge this week. Someone asked me to simply go to the bookshelf in my office at home where I do a lot of my work and take out four books and then tell what they are. So I said I would.

Now one thing to understand is that my house has a lot of bookshelves and a lot of books. The ones in my office change as I get involved in one thing or another. The ones that stay there a lot are about the bible and canon law, but there are others that tend to come and go. Then there are some that I put there at some point in the past and they just stayed there.

But my four were interesting. The first is ***Speaking in Parables*** by Sallie McFague. It is subtitled "A study in metaphor and theology." Doctor McFague is a protestant theologian who challenges people to allow the meaning of a parable to truly be understood. She is not an easy writer and the print in the book is too small, but I have read and used it fairly often over the years.

The second book is one I do use reasonably often. I have a number of business management books. In my seminary day future priests were given no training in business or personnel management. Now they get a little, but not much. I went back to school (Idaho State University) to learn how to manage a business, and I do use books to help me. One of my favorites is ***The Everything Managing People Book*** by Gary McClain and Deborah Romaine. It is simple and common sense. Right now, in fact, I am using it for a new set of parish staff evaluations.

The third book on the shelf was ***A Field Guide to U.S. Congregations*** by Cynthia Woolever and Deborah Bruce. It is one of a number of books in what is called the sociology of religion. It simply describes what works and what does not in most churches, both Catholic and Protestant. This one is from 2004, but is still filled with some good ideas.

The fourth book is ***Four Witnesses*** which is a compilation of the works of four early church fathers, Clement of Rome, Ignatius of Antioch, Justin Martyr, and Irenaeus of Lyons. It is by Rod Bennett. It is one of a number of books by former Protestant writers who have become Catholic. This one is pretty heavy because the four writers are tough to read and understand sometimes. But it is good.

As I was putting these four back into the bookshelf, two more fell out, both interesting. The first is ***A New Commandment, toward a renewed rite for the washing of the feet*** by Peter Jeffery. It's a book I received when I was reviewing books for a national liturgical magazine (the source of many of my books). It is interesting only because it is more of a solution in search of a problem.

But the second book is one I am using now and have used in the past, ***Mark as Story, an introduction to the narrative of a Gospel***, by David Rhoads and Donald Michie; both are good theologians, and the introduction is by the famous Reynolds Price. It's a good book. I hope this satisfies my challenger.

## “Our Faith”

There are times when non-Catholic people knock at your door claiming that their doctrine is the truth to live by. They start with a question like: “Are you saved? Adding, If you accept Jesus, you always are saved.” When Catholic people in the house either are not prepared to answer those questions, or are not practicing their faith, the questions become interesting and they believe what these people are offering. These fundamentalist doctrines about salvation are harmful to people because they presume “Once saved always saved,” and it gives the people the assumption that it is okay to take on violence and sometimes even end their own lives. Why? Fundamentalist doctrines are incomplete! At baptism we are incorporated to the community of believers and into Christ and His church. We know that baptism removes sin, but not the human inclination to sin. We know that we need the Sacrament of Penance, confession, to do good deeds, and to love our neighbor and practice charity on a daily basis. The Bible does not support the concept that, “once save always saved.” In the scripture passage, St. Paul writes to the Hebrews: “Do not go astray by all kinds of strange teachings” (Hb13:9) be aware! So when a Catholic is asked: Are you saved? The response should be: Yes! I was saved at my baptism and every day.

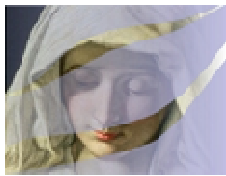
