From the Pastor,

The old rectory and office building is gone. That spot seems so barren. I want to thank all of those who have helped in this project, especially John Krueger. It took a long time to sell the building to someone who would move it and save it. I thank the new owner, Juan Oleaga, and the moving company for being so easy to work with. And I thank all of the people who came to the "House Moving Party" last Sunday night. It was fun.

We are continuing to finalize the paper work and waiting for the building permit. The sewer work is finished. We will have the official groundbreaking at 7 PM on Saturday August 4th, after a combined Mass at 6 PM. We will not have the regular 5 o'clock English Mass nor the regular 7 o'clock Spanish Mass that evening.

We will also soon have a big picture of our new logo and symbol for Saint Mary's, replacing the image of the church building we have used for many years. It is three roses and a butterfly. The rose has always been a very special symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary in church art, symbolized most powerfully in the famous "Rose Windows" in many medieval cathedrals and churches. In the litany of the Blessed Virgin the "Mystical Rose" is one of her most important titles. Roses are also the symbol for Our Lady of Guadalupe and red roses in particular.

The three roses are at different stages of development. There is a rose bud, symbolizing the very young Mary at the time of the Annunciation and the Birth of Jesus. There is a rose which is about half open symbolizing Mary as the mother of Jesus and wife of Joseph all the years while Jesus grew up. And there is the fully mature open rose symbolizing Mary as her son died on the cross and her life after that.

The butterfly is one of the most ancient symbols of the resurrected Christ. We have chosen the Monarch butterfly because it is the state butterfly of Idaho and is also one of the symbols of Mexico. It migrates from one to the other.

We hope to have a full colored picture of the logo in the bulletin in a few weeks.

La vieja rectoría también conocida como la oficina parroquial ya fue removida. El terreno donde se ubicaba se ve vacío. Quiero agradecer a toda la gente que ha ayudado con este proyecto, especialmente a John Krueger. Nos tardamos mucho tiempo en poder vender el edificio a alguien que se encargaría de mudarla y conservarla. Le quiero dar las gracias al nuevo dueño, Juan Oleaga, y a la compañía de mudanza por ser muy serviciales. También le quiero agradecer a toda la gente que asistió a "La celebración de la mudanza de la casa de Santa María" el domingo pasado. Fue muy divertido.

Continuamos tratando de dar por terminado el papeleo necesario para iniciar la construcción de la nueva iglesia. Al mismo tiempo esperamos que nos entreguen el permiso de construcción. El trabajo del alcantarillado está terminado. El sábado 4 de agosto a las 7 de la tarde será la ceremonia oficial de la primera piedra de nuestra nueva iglesia. Esta ceremonia se llevará a cabo después de una Misa bilingüe a las 6 de la tarde. Este día no habrá Misa en inglés de las 5 de la tarde ni Misa en español a las 7 de la tarde.

Próximamente tendremos una gran foto del nuevo logotipo de la iglesia, reemplazará de la imagen del edificio de la iglesia que hemos utilizado durante varios años. El logotipo consiste de tres rosas y una mariposa. En el arte de la iglesia, la rosa siempre ha sido un símbolo muy especial de la bienaventurada Virgen María, simbolizado poderosamente en las famosas "Ventanas de Rosas" en varias iglesias y catedrales medievales. Uno de los títulos más importantes en la letanía de la Santísima virgen es "Rosa Mística". También las rosas, especialmente las rojas, son un símbolo de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe.

Las tres rosas que lleva el logotipo están dibujadas en diferentes etapas de desarrollo. La rosa en capullo simboliza a la joven María en el tiempo de la Anunciación y el nacimiento de Jesús. En el logotipo también esta una rosa empezando a abrirse simbolizando a María como la madre de Dios y la esposa de José durante los años en que crecía Jesús. Y por último, en el logotipo esta una rosa en todo su esplendor simbolizando a María durante la muerte de su Hijo Jesús en la cruz y el resto de su vida.

Uno de los símbolos más antiguos de la resurrección de Cristo es la mariposa. La mariposa que hemos escogido para nuestro logotipo es la Monarca porque es la mariposa estatal de Idaho y porque es un gran símbolo de México. La Monarca emigra entre los Estados Unidos y México.

En unas cuantas semanas esperamos tener el logotipo en color en nuestro boletín.

16 de Julio: Fiesta de la Bienaventurada Virgen María del Monte Carmelo (Virgen del Carmen). Las Escrituras Sagradas alaban la hermosura del Carmelo, "jardín florido" donde Elías defendió la pureza de la fe de Israel en el Dios viviente. Allí nació, en los comienzos del siglo XIII, la Orden del Carmen. La fiesta principal de la Orden del Carmelo era originalmente la Asunción de la Santísima Virgen (15 de agosto), pero entre 1376 y 1386 se estableció en la Orden la costumbre de celebrar una fiesta especial de la Virgen para conmemorar la aprobación de la regla carmelitana, llevada a cabo por el Papa Honorio III en 1226. Al parecer, dicha costumbre se originó en Inglaterra y como fecha de la fiesta se escogió el 16 de julio, puesto que en ese día, según la tradición de la Orden, la Virgen se apareció a San Simón Stock dándole el escapulario. A principios del siglo XVII, la fiesta era conocida como "la fiesta del escapulario". Es oficialmente la Patrona de Chile. Entre los hispanos es muy popular esta advocación mariana y muchas mujeres llevan el nombre de María del Carmen (Carmelita); y muchos hombres el nombre de José Carmen (Carmelo). "También yo llevo sobre mi corazón, desde hace tanto tiempo, el escapulario del Carmen. Por ello pido a la Virgen del Carmen que nos ayude a todos los religiosos y las religiosas del Carmelo y a los piadosos fieles que la veneran filialmente, a crecer en su amor e irradiar en el mundo la presencia de esta Mujer del silencio y de la oración, invocada como Madre de la misericordia, Madre de la esperanza y de la gracia" (Juan Pablo II).

The 16th of July: Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel. The Holy Bible praises the beauty of Carmel, "the flowery garden" where Elijah defended the purity of the faith of Israel in the name of the living God. The origin of the Carmelite Order began in the thirteenth century. The primary feast of the era of the Carmelite Order was originally on the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin (August 15), but between 1376 and 1386 it was established within the Order a custom of celebrating the special feast of the Virgin in order to commemorate the approval of the Carmelite rule, carried out by Pope Honorius III in 1226. As it may seem, such custom originated in England and the date chosen for the feast would be July 16, since on that day, according to the tradition of the Order, the virgin appeared to Saint Simon Stock giving him the scapular. In the beginning of the seventeenth century, the feast was known as "the feast of the scapular". She is officially the Patron Saint of Chile. Among the Hispanic population it is a popular Marian avocation for many women to have the name María del Carmelite (Carmelita), and many men to have the name José Carmen (Carmelo). "I, too, have worn the Scapular of Carmel over my heart for a long time! Out of my love for our common heavenly Mother, whose protection I constantly experience, I hope that this Marian devotion will help all the men and women religious of Carmel and the devout faithful who venerate her with filial affection to grow in her love and to radiate to the world the presence of this Woman of silence and prayer, invoked as Mother of Mercy, Mother of Hope and Grace ..." (Pope John Paul II).
