Por una ley de inmigración justa

Dice el Arzobispo Theodore McCarrick que la ley de inmigración de nuestro país es defectuosa y necesita reparaciones. Es un asunto de justicia. Por eso proponen que toda futura legislación debería incluir:

- Políticas que se dirijan a las raíces de la inmigración, tales como el desarrollo económico, para que los emigrantes puedan permanecer en sus países de origen.
- Reforma del sistema de inmigración, incluyendo la adopción de un programa de legalización de trabajadores inmigrantes y sus familias. Un programa de trabajador temporal, con las protecciones adecuadas, tanto de los trabajadores de Estados Unidos como de los extranjeros, y una reforma del sistema de preferencia familiar.
- Restauración de las protecciones legales para los emigrantes, de manera que puedan defenderse en la corte. Esto esta en coherencia con los valores americanos.
- Una legislación de Trabajos de Agricultura, Oportunidades, Beneficios, y Seguridad que proteja a nuestros campesinos, y el DREAM act, que ayude a estudiantes indocumentados que llegan a nuestro país con sus familias, y que el Acta de Protección de Niños Extranjeros no acompañados se incluyan en el paquete de medidas.
- Únicamente un enfoque total a la reforma de inmigración podría soslayar nuestra crisis actual. Por eso la Conferencia Católica de Estados Unidos se opone firmemente a la HR 4437.

For just immigration legislation

Archbishop Theodore McCarrick says that the country's immigration law is faulty and in need of mending. This is an issue of justice. That is why any future legislation should include:

- Policies addressing the roots of immigration, such as economic development of countries so that people can remain in their countries of origin.
- A reform of the immigration system including the adoption of a legalization program for migrant workers and their families. A guest worker program, with the adequate protections both of U.S. and foreign workers, and a reform of the system of family preference.
- Restoration of legal protections and due process for immigrants so that they can have their day in court. This is consistent with American values.
- The Agricultural Jobs, Opportunities, Benefits, and Security legislation, which protects farm workers, the DREAM Act, which helps undocumented students who come to this country with their families, as well as the Unaccompanied Alien Child Protection Act should be included in the policies.
- Only a holistic approach to immigration reform can solve our present crisis. That is why the USCCB is totally opposed to the HR 4437.

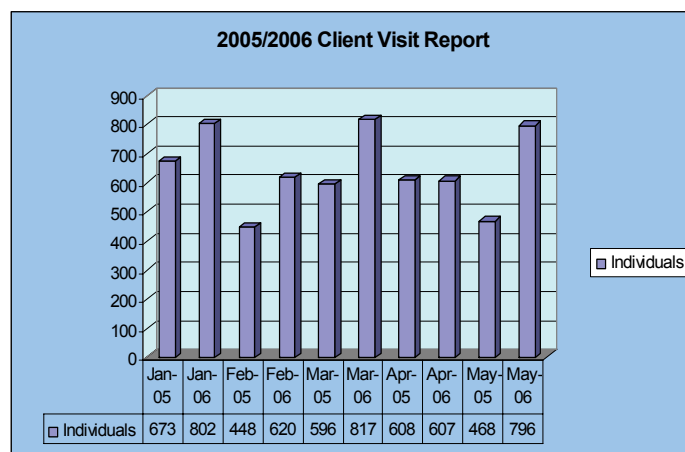
ONE OF ST. MARY'S JEWELS NEEDS HELP!

In late August, Bishop Kelly will send us a list of the students who have listed St. Mary's as their parish. We are required to verify the name and activity level for each family. Please take the time to introduce yourself to Father Faucher, Father Miller, Father Camacho and other members of the parish staff. Let them be able to put a face to the name before this list arrives.

The families unknown to the office or parish staff will be denied as St. Mary's students, and will not be eligible for the tuition break.
