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From the Pastor,

One of the most interesting courses I took in graduate school was on the Philosophy of History. I had taken courses on the History of Philosophy when I got my degree in Philosophy, but this would be totally different. The focus of the course was looking for trends and patterns in human history and the relationship between these big trends and patterns and specific individuals and human actions.

One of the patterns which struck me was the importance of a march or exile in the life of any culture or any group. This is exemplified by the exodus in the Bible, by the movements of the Barbarian Tribes down into Roman Europe, by the Long March of the Chinese, by the trek west of the Mormons. It is true also in smaller moves and exiles such as the Pilgrims coming to America, or even in parishes moving out of their church building into temporary quarters. Some philosophers of history call these events *The Adventure Event* which defines the group and makes it strong.

Thus I can say now that "The Adventure Begins" for us at Saint Mary's. We will be camping out for the next seven or eight months. It will not be bad, but it will also not be easy. Change is never easy, especially for religions and church congregations. But it will be an adventure.

We will have a lot of new things to get used to, such as where we sit or how we go to Communion. While a lot of work has gone into the planning of this adventure, I am sure that we have not thought of everything and glitches will happen. When they do we will solve them.

I do think it is important to have some common customs which we all agree to follow. Some of these are:

- Please genuflect facing the altar as you go into the pews. Even though the Blessed Sacrament will be behind you in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, the altar is also a symbol of Christ and it makes no sense to try to "aim" your genuflection. God understands the meaning of the gesture.
- Please do not use the Blessed Sacrament Chapel as the cry room even though that will be its ultimate use. For the next months use the narthex [lobby] as the cry room.
- Please talk and socialize in the narthex rather than in the church itself before and after Mass. There are people who come early to pray and who stay late to pray. Because we have never had a narthex or gathering space people have gotten used to socializing in the church itself. That is really not a good habit.
- Please do not let children play on the steps and walls at the front door. We will be doing something to make those areas more child proof than they are now.
- Please enjoy the new church. Let the adventure begin.

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la del postgrado fue diferente. Su enfoque era encontrar las tendencias y patrones en la historia de la humanidad y la relación entre éstos e individuos específicos y acciones humanas.

Uno de los patrones que me sacudió fue el de la importancia de una procesión o exilio en la vida de cualquier cultura o grupo. Por ejemplo, el éxodo en la Biblia, las migraciones de las tribus bárbaras a la Europa romana, la Gran Marcha de los chinos y la Travesía hacia el oeste de los mormones. Esto se aplica también a pequeñas procesiones y exilios tales como los peregrinos que llegaron a Estados Unidos o aún al movimiento de las parroquias, de su templo a otra sede temporal. Algunos filósofos de la historia llaman a estos eventos "El Evento de la Aventura" el cual define al grupo y lo hace fuerte.

Así que ahora puedo decir que "La Aventura comienza" para nosotros en Santa María. Estaremos acampando por los siguientes siete u ocho meses. No la pasaremos mal pero tampoco será fácil. El cambio nunca es fácil, especialmente para las religiones y comunidades parroquiales; pero será una aventura.

Habrán muchas cosas nuevas a las que acostumbrarnos como donde sentarnos o como ir a tomar la comunión. Aún cuando se ha planeado mucho de esta aventura, estoy seguro que no hemos pensado en todo y saldrán imprevistos que resolveremos según se vayan dando.

Creo que es importante adoptar algunas costumbres comunes que todos acordemos seguir. Algunas de éstas son:

- Favor de santiguarse y reverenciar mirando hacia el altar conforme van hacia las bancas. Aún cuando el Santísimo estará detrás de ustedes en la Capilla del Bendito Sacramento, el altar también es un símbolo de Cristo y no tiene caso tratar de persignarse o dirigir su reverencia hacia la capilla. Dios entiende el significado de su gesto.
- Favor de no usar la Capilla del Bendito Sacramento como cuarto para niños aún cuando ese será su uso [cuando termine la construcción]. En los próximos meses por favor usen el vestíbulo (a la entrada) como el cuarto para niños.
- Favor de platicar y socializar en el vestíbulo en vez de adentro del templo antes y después de misa. Hay gente que llega temprano o se queda después de la misa para rezar. Como nunca hemos tenido un vestíbulo o lugar de reunión, la gente se ha acostumbrado a socializar adentro del templo. Esa no es realmente una buena costumbre.
- Por favor, no dejen que los niños jueguen en los escalones y las bardas a la entrada. Vamos a hacer algo para hacer esas áreas más a prueba de niños de lo que son ahora.
- Por favor, disfruten la nueva iglesia. Que empiece la aventura.

La llegada del mes de junio nos presenta la oportunidad de meditar sobre la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Esta devoción ha existido desde los primeros tiempos de la Iglesia, desde que se meditaba en el costado y corazón abiertos de Jesús, de donde brotaron sangre y agua. El corazón aparece muy frecuentemente en la Biblia con un rico significado. Como han recordado frecuentemente los Papas, la devoción al Corazón de Jesús tiene un sólido fundamento en las Escrituras. Entendida a la luz de la Sagrada Escritura, la expresión "Corazón de Jesús" designa el misterio mismo de Cristo, la totalidad de su ser, su persona considerada en el núcleo más íntimo y esencia: Hijo de Dios, sabiduría increada, caridad infinita, principio de salvación y santificación. Se nos pide a todos los creyentes "amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente" (Mt 22,37). Sin embargo, El sabía que nosotros somos incapaces de amar así. Sólo el amor divino es capaz de darse plenamente. Es por eso que El mismo bajó del cielo, tomó un corazón humano y con su corazón nos amó hasta el extremo, siendo traspasado por nosotros. El amor de Dios se derrama desde el Calvario. Los creyentes de todos los tiempos necesitamos contemplarlo y aprender de El que es "manso y humilde de corazón" (Mt 11,29). Sólo quien se deja traspasar el corazón por amor a Dios adquiere la capacidad de amar como El ama. Esta devoción se distingue tanto por la intimidad de amor con Jesús como por su necesario fruto: la obediencia total hasta la Cruz. Yo fui consagrado por mis papás al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús desde antes de mi nacimiento y me pusieron el nombre de Jesús en su honor.

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The arrival of the month of June presents us the opportunity to meditate on the devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion has existed from the beginning of time in the history of the church; through the open wound and open heart of Jesus from where blood and water sprung. The heart appears more frequently in the Bible with a rich meaning. As the Popes have remembered frequently, the devotion to the Heart of Jesus has a strong foundation in the Holy Scriptures. According to the Holy Scriptures, the expression "Heart of Jesus" refers to the very same mystery of Christ, His whole being, His person considered in the most intimate and essential part of Himself: The Son of God, incarnated wisdom, infinite charity, salvation and sanctification. As believers, we are all asked to do the following: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." (Mt 22:37). However He knew we were not able to love that way. Only divine love is able to give itself totally. That is why He came down from heaven Himself, took a human heart and with His heart, He loved us to such a point of being pierced through by us. God's love flows from Calvary. As believers of all times, we need to contemplate and learn from Him who is "meek and lowly in heart" (Mt 11:29). Only those who allow their hearts to be pierced through for the sake of God's love, get the capacity to love as He loves. This devotion stands out, as much as by the intimacy of the Love for Jesus, as for its necessary result: total obedience including the ultimate sacrifice symbolized by the Cross. I was consecrated by my parents to the Sacred Heart of Jesus since before I was born, and I was named Jesus in His honor.
