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From the Pastor,

This weekend we finally have the open house in the new part of the church. I am very grateful to CM Company for making this possible. In just three weeks we will move from the old church into the new part, which is really just the back half of the final church. This weekend you will see that some of our treasures of statues and stations have been moved into storage for preservation and cleaning.

There are many to thank for all that we can now do and for how far we have come. I will be mentioning those people and doing a lot of thanking in the weeks to come.

But this week I want to make sure that we keep a clear perspective on where we are as a parish community. The construction and building project has taken a lot of time, effort, energy, and money these past months and years. All of this is very good. But ultimately buildings are just buildings, The essence of Saint Mary's Parish is our community of people and the work we do to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. What is most important is that we continue to tell each other the good news of Jesus, to proclaim his resurrection, and feed the hungry.

As we move into our new quarters I want us to keep the Parish Food Bank very much in focus. It, along with Saint Mary's School, is one of the great jewels in our crown. Right now the Parish Food Bank is being stretched more than it has ever been stretched before. The number of clients is way up, the cost of food purchased by the Food Bank is way up, and the need is growing very fast.

It is my hope that more and more people can "adopt" a food product and purchase a case of the product each month (or even more often) for the Food Bank. Elsewhere in the bulletin this week is a list of the products the Food Bank needs most often. A donated case of food can be left on the porch of the Parish Office or even better left at the Food Bank during the times it is open. It is amazing how much this helps.

I would also like to again remind people that if they can spare the check from the government for economic stimulus, the four areas of parish finance could use the money very much: general fund, building fund, St. Mary's School, and the Food Bank. Just write down what you want it to go to.

If we keep our perspective and know that the building is just a means to a much greater end, then our celebration as it comes closer to completion will be authentic and Gospel oriented.

### **Para un buen ministerio familiar <sup>(1)</sup>**

En un artículo publicado en *Origins*, Alejandro Aguilera Titus, director asociado del Secretariado para Asuntos Hispánicos aconseja siete pasos para un buen ministerio familiar:

1. Trabajar con las parejas hispanas desde donde estén éstas, sin esperar a que vayan a inscribirse en programas parroquiales.
2. Dar la bienvenida y hacer que se sientan en casa. Establecer un grupo para parejas es un paso muy concreto que puede ser muy útil.
3. Desarrollar ministerios y ministros.
4. Construir relaciones entre culturas y ministerios, en maneras tan concretas como liturgias y oraciones biculturales o multiculturales, en desarrollo de la comunidad, programas de formación o programas de servicio.
5. Formación y desarrollo de liderazgo. Invertir los recursos parroquiales necesarios en el desarrollo del liderazgo y la formación de las parejas hispanas. La tarea central es desarrollar una base de liderazgo para el ministerio matrimonial y familiar dentro de la comunidad hispana.
6. Abrir las puertas del proceso de toma de decisiones. Asegurar la participación de las parejas hispanas en las decisiones parroquiales.
7. Fortalecer el sentido de pertenencia. Las parroquias que alcanzan este nivel de desarrollo están bien equipadas con un equipo hispano de liderazgo bien preparado y vibrante. Los hispanos pasan de tener un sentimiento de simple pertenencia a otro en que la parroquia les pertenece a ellos. La planificación parroquial, pues, se hace teniendo en consideración las necesidades, aspiraciones y contribuciones de todos los feligreses, tanto hispanos como de otros grupos étnicos.

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### For a good family ministry<sup>(1)</sup>

In an article published in *Origins* by Alejandro Aguilera Titus, associate director of the Secretariat of Hispanic Affairs, seven steps are recommended for family ministry:

1. Work with Hispanic couples from where they are without expecting them to register in parish programs.
2. Welcome them and make them feel at home. Establishing a group for couples is a solid step and can be very useful.
3. Develop ministries and ministers.
4. Build relationships between cultures and ministries in concrete forms such as, bi-cultural or multi-cultural liturgy and prayers in community development, formation and service programs.
5. Formation and leadership development. Invest the necessary parish resources in developing leadership and formation of Hispanic couples. The main task is to develop a leadership base for marriage and family ministry within the Hispanic community.
6. Open the doors to the decision making process. Assure participation of Hispanic couples in parish decisions.
7. Strengthen the sense of belonging. Parishes that achieve this level of development are equipped with a well prepared and vibrant team of Hispanic leaders. Hispanics go from feeling it belongs to others, to feeling the parish belongs to them. Parish planning is done by taking into consideration the needs, aspirations and contributions of all parishioners, Hispanics and other ethnic groups.

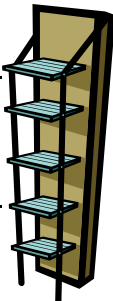
