La fiesta de Pentecostés es de las más importantes de nuestra fe. La venida del Espíritu Santo echa a andar la Iglesia recién fundada por Jesucristo. El Espíritu Santo nos hace capaces no sólo de entender sino de llevar a la práctica las enseñanzas de nuestro Maestro. Pero sobre todo, el Espíritu Santo une en un solo Cuerpo a los tan diversos y diferentes miembros de la Iglesia de Cristo. En efecto, la Iglesia nació bajo el signo de la pluralidad. La fiesta de Pentecostés celebra el fin de la maldición que pesaba sobre el mundo desde los días de la Torre de Babel: la confusión de lenguas. De ahora en adelante, el mismo mensaje y la misma fe podrán ser proclamadas en todas las lenguas de la tierra. La Iglesia del Nuevo Testamento tiene un carácter diverso y plural. La palabra "Iglesia" se aplicaba tanto a la Iglesia Universal como a las Iglesias Locales. La palabra católico/a fue usada por primera vez por san Ignacio de Antioquía (alrededor del año 107). San Cirilo de Jerusalén usaba esta explicación: "la Iglesia es llamada "católica" porque se extiende por todo el mundo; porque enseña universalmente todas las verdades que el creyente debe conocer; porque trae a la verdadera religión toda clase de personas, mandatarios y vasallos, instruídos e ignorantes; porque universalmente trata y cura toda clase de pecado; porque posee toda clase de virtudes y de dones espirituales que se puedan nombrar..." (año 386). Lo que hace que la Iglesia sea Una, no es el hablar la misma lengua, ni tener la misma cultura, ni pertenecer al mismo grupo étnico, ni venir ni estar en un mismo lugar; sino el mismo Espíritu que ha sido derramado sobre todos y cada uno de nosotros el día de nuestro bautismo. La pluralidad en el mismo Espíritu, es una gran riqueza; la pluralidad sin el mismo Espíritu se convierte en fuente de conflictos y divisiones. Celebremos con toda la alegría que quepa en nuestros corazones el gran regalo del Espíritu Santo que el Padre nos ha enviado en el nombre de Jesús.

The Pentecost celebration is one of the most important celebrations of our faith. The coming of the Holy Spirit puts the church, recently founded by Jesus Christ, in to motion. The Holy Spirit gives us the capacity to not only understand but to also practice the teachings of our Teacher. Above all things, the Holy Spirit unites in one body all of the diverse members of Christ's church. In fact, the church was born under the sign of plurality. The celebration of Pentecost consists of celebrating the end of the curse that weighed down on the world since the times of the Tower of Babel: the confusion of languages. From now on, the same message and the same faith can be proclaimed in all of the languages on the earth. The church of the New Testament had a diverse and plural character. The word "Church" was applicable to not only the Universal Church but also to the Local Churches. The word "Catholic" was used for the first time by Saint Ignatius of Antioch (around the year 107). Saint Cyril of Jerusalem used the following explanation: "the church is called "catholic" because it extends throughout the world; because it universally teaches all of the truths that the believer should know; because it brings to the true religion different kinds of people, officials and subjects, educated and uneducated; because it universally treats and cures all kinds of sin; because it possess all classes of virtues and spiritual gifts that can be named..." (the year 386). The thing that makes the church One, is not being able to speak the same language, and not by having the same culture, and not by pertaining to the same ethnic group, and not by moving to a place and staying in that same place; but it is the same Spirit that has been spread out over each and everyone of us the day of our baptism. The plurality of this same Spirit, is a grand treasure; the plurality without the same Spirit is converted in to the cause of conflicts and division. Let us celebrate with all of the joy that we can fit within our hearts the amazing gift of the Holy Spirit that our Father has sent to us in the name of Jesus.

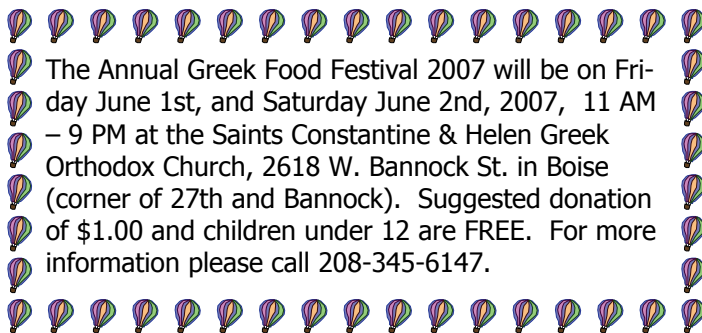

RENOVATION UPDATE

- We have finalized the contract with the City and the work will begin in a few weeks to start re-routing the old sewer line.
- A new door will be installed at the new parish office. If anyone needs access to the Parish Center please contact John or Melissa for new keys.
- The sale of the Castle Drive property was completed on 5/16 and the proceeds deposited to the Renovation Savings account.
- The statue of St. Fiacre will be removed this week and stored during renovation.
- The rectory will be removed most likely by the middle of June.
- We are working with the architects and our builder to finalize the cost of construction. We fully expect the cost to be higher than the projected number we've been using of \$3.0M.
