In general, one of the Hispanic, Catholic Characteristics, and in particular of a Mexican Hispanic, is the celebration of the patron saint of their hometown. We call them feasts of the patron saints. For many of us who live in this country, we make plans to go to our hometowns specifically during the celebrations of our patron saint's feast. Between parentheses, this to a great extent explains the devotion to the Virgin and to the saints. St. Martin of Tours, well known as St. Martin the gentleman, is the patron saint of my hometown. His feast day is November 11 but it is a celebration of nine days also known as a novena. I would like to share briefly something about the life of this popular saint in Mexico and in the entire world. He was born in Hungary but his parents went to live in Italy. He was a son of a veteran in the service and at 15 years old he dressed in a military uniform. One night he saw in his dream that Jesus was wearing the half mantle he had given a cold beggar. In his dream, Martin heard Jesus saying: "Martin, today you covered me in your mantle." After this vision, Martin turned in his arms and decided to follow Christ in a different form. Afterwards he went to the city of Pointiers, France where the wise Bishop, St. Hilary, received him and took on the responsibility of instructing him. St. Hilary gave him some land where he could dedicate his time in prayer and meditation on the Sacred Scriptures. This is where he founded his first monastery. Some time afterwards he was consecrated as the Bishop of Tours and there he **founded** another monastery and soon he had 80 monks. Thanks to the miracles, dedication and the mercy of the new bishop, soon paganism disappeared from that city.

Una de las características propias del catolicismo hispano en general, y del mexicano en particular, es la celebración del santo patrono del pueblo. Las llamamos fiestas patronales. Muchos de los que vivimos en este país, hacemos planes para ir a nuestros pueblos precisamente durante las celebraciones patronales. Entre paréntesis, esto explica en gran parte la devoción a la Virgen y a los santos. San Martín de Tours, popularmente conocido como San Martín Caballero, es el santo patrono de mi pueblo. Su fiesta es el 11 de noviembre, pero se celebra durante nueve días, conocido como Novenario. Quiero compartir brevemente algo de la vida de este santo muy popular en México y en todo el mundo. Nació en Hungría, pero sus padres se fueron a vivir a Italia. Era hijo de un veterano del ejército y a los 15 años ya vestía el uniforme militar. Una noche vió en sueños que Jesucristo se le presentaba vestido con el medio manto que él le había regalado a un pobre mendigo que tenía frío. Oyó, en el sueño, que Cristo le decía: "Martín, hoy me cubriste con tu manto". Luego de esta visión, Martín renunció a las armas y decidió seguir a Cristo en otra forma. En seguida se fue a la ciudad de Poitiers, Francia, donde era obispo el gran sabio san Hilario, quien lo recibió como discípulo y se encargó de instruirlo. San Hilario le regaló unas tierras para que se dedicara a la oración y meditación de las Sagradas Escrituras. Allí fundó su primer convento. Poco después, fue consagrado obispo de Tours y allí fundó otro convento y pronto ya tenía 80 monjes. Gracias a los milagros, la dedicación y la piedad del nuevo obispo, pronto desapareció el paganismo de aquella ciudad.
