Hoy celebramos el "Día de la Raza". En una buena parte de los países de América Latina, el 12 de octubre celebramos la fiesta de nuestra identidad cultural y racial expresada con los nombres más o menos conocidos de: latinoamericanos/as, iberoamericanos/as, latinos/as, hispanos/as. Pero bien podríamos decir que nuestro verdadero nombre es: pueblo mestizo. Porque, en efecto, nuestra identidad proviene de la mezcla de por lo menos tres diferentes razas, culturas y religiones: europea (principalmente española), africana y pueblos del continente americano; catolicismo, religiones espiritistas (de Africa) y creencias de los nativos de las Américas. A esta mezcla se le conoce como mestizaje y se llevó a cabo durante la primera parte del siglo XVI. Por lo tanto, desde este punto de vista, somos prácticamente el pueblo, la raza, más joven de la tierra. Podríamos decir, que estamos todavía en proceso de formación. El grado o nivel de mestizaje es distinto en cada región del continente. El símbolo más característico de nuestra raza es la Virgen de Guadalupe, a quien reconocemos como Madre del Pueblo Mestizo: Madre y Emperatriz de las Américas. Otros símbolos son el color de nuestra piel y la lengua que hablamos. Un saludo y un abrazo a todos los miembros de este pueblo. ¡Viva la raza!

Today we celebrate "Day of the Race." In a large part of the Latin American Countries, October 12 we celebrate the feast of our cultural identity and racial expressions where we are also referred to as: Latin Americans, Iberian Americans, Latinos/Latinas, Hispanics. But we could very well say that our true name is: Mestizo People. Because in effect, our identity comes from at least three different racial, cultural and religious backgrounds: Europe (mainly Spain), African and places on the American Continent; Catholicism, spiritualist religions (from Africa) and Native American Beliefs. This blending of cultures is also known as Mestizaje or a mixed race, took place during the first part of the 16th Century. Based on this point of view, we are practically the youngest people, race, on earth. We could say that we are still in the formation process. The grade or level of Mestizaje is different in each region of the continent. The most significant symbolism of our race is Our Lady of Guadalupe whom we view as the Mother of our Mestizo People: Mother, Empress, of the Americas. Other symbols are the color of our skin and the language we speak. Greetings to all of the members of this nation. Viva la raza!
