There is actually a technical Latin word in the church to describe such a group, it is "vagi." We are completing arrangements for the use of Madison School for the weekend Masses and are now working on a place for the offices, the Food Bank, and a chapel for daily Mass and baptisms. There are many possibilities.

By the time you read this at least one of the trees in front of the office and church will have been taken out. The rest will come out later this fall. We have put up notices that the office building, the old rectory, is for sale "to be moved." If you or someone you know is interested please call John Krueger at the office.

El 15 de octubre la Iglesia celebra a Santa Teresa de Jesús, religiosa y reformadora de la Orden Carmelita y gran mística. Bajo el nombre de Teresa Sánchez Cepeda Dávila y Ahumada, nació en la ciudad de Avila, España, el 28 de marzo de 1515. desde niña mostró un carácter fuerte y un temperamento impetuoso. A los doce años se consagra a María y a los 20 ingresa en el Carmelo de la Encarnación; pero cae gravemente enferma. Es entonces, en 1539, que tiene las primeras experiencias místicas. Invoca la ayuda de San José y recobra la salud. En 1560 tiene una experiencia mística que fue definitiva en su camino a la santidad: vio el infierno. Desde ese momento busca la perfección absoluta, pero se da cuenta que la congregación carmelita no le ayudaba en esto. Entonces decide reformarla. Así nacen las carmelitas descalzas. El primer monasterio de la orden reformada es fundado en Avila, bajo el nombre y patrocinio de san José. Desde entonces ella empieza a llamarse Teresa de Jesús. Con la ayuda de su amigo y confesor, san Juan de la Cruz, sufre la envidia y desconfianza, pero juntos fundan 17 monasterios femeninos y 15 masculinos. Viaja, organiza, predica, escribe y llega a ser famosa. Por orden expresa de sus superiores, escribe su autobiografía titulada "El Libro de la Vida"; "El Libro de las Moradas" o "Castillo Interior" (sobre cómo poder llegar a la vida mística); y "Las Fundaciones" (historia de cómo fue creciendo su comunidad). Estas obras las escribió en medio de mareos y dolores de cabeza. Exhausta de esta incesante actividad y golpeada por el sufrimiento espiritual y físico y los ataques muere santamente en Alba de Torres, el 4 de octubre de 1582. En 1622 el Papa Gregorio XV la declaró santa; y en 1970 Pablo VI la declaró doctora de la Iglesia Universal. Es patrona de España. Su gran influencia en la vida religiosa de su tiempo se extiende hasta nuestros días. Las carmelitas descalzas son ahora 14,000 en 835 conventos en el mundo; y los carmelitas descalzos son 3,800 en 490 conventos. Es una de las místicas más grandes de la Iglesia.
