### PASTORS' PAGE

From the Pastor,

I begin by thanking all of those involved with the Parish Picnic last weekend. It was a great event with somewhere around 500 people attending. It took a great deal of work to make it happen and I thank those who did so very much.

At the picnic I announced that we are working to have our weekend Masses during the year we will be out of the church building at Madison School [23rd and Madison Streets]. It looks like this will work out well for us. At the present time we are still working out where the parish offices will be, where the Food Bank will be, and where our daily Mass Chapel will be. We do have a large number of ideas we are working on and I hope those decisions can be made and firmed up soon.

This coming week all three priests will be away from Boise from Monday until Friday at the "Priests Study Days." Usually these are here in Boise and we stay at our regular homes, but this year someone managed to get some kind of deal for rooms at Tamarack in Donnelly. All the active priests of the diocese will be there and some of the retired priests as well. There will be a priest staying for emergencies in Boise, and he can be contacted through the parish office.

For the past year the priests have been working on issues of morale and psychological working conditions taking into account all that has happened to priests in the past few years. For all priests these have been very difficult years. The loss of good friends from the priesthood, the priest shortage and resulting increased workload, the child abuse scandals involving priests, the resulting change in all priests way of life, the public mockery of priests and the priesthood, the mishandling of the scandal by many bishops and cover-ups, the increased tension between priests and bishops, the increased conservatism of many newly ordained priests -- these are some of the issues we have been trying to face and deal with. It is these items we will continue to work on at our study days.

Please pray for us while we are gone, and if possible please plan on attending all or part of the Fall Religious Education Conference this weekend at BSU.

Del Pastor:

Primeramente quiero agradecer el esfuerzo de todas las personas que estuvieron involucradas en la preparación del picnic parroquial el fin de semana pasado. Fue un gran evento con aproximadamente 500 personas en asistencia. Fue un grande esfuerzo para realizar este evento y les agradezco su trabajo.

En el picnic anuncié que estamos trabajando para asegurar que podamos celebrar misas en la escuela de Madison. Parece que esta opción va a trabajar bien para nosotros. Actualmente estamos trabajando en asegurar un lugar para las oficinas parroquiales, el banco de comida y la capilla para las misas diarias. Tenemos varias ideas que estamos considerando y espero macizar estas decisiones muy pronto.

Esta semana que viene los 3 sacerdotes van a salir de Boise a participar en días de estudio para los sacerdotes desde el lunes hasta el viernes. Regularmente estas reuniones se llevan a cabo aquí mismo y nos podemos quedar en nuestras propias casas pero este año alguien nos pudo conseguir una buena oferta en el hotel de Tamarack en el pueblo de Donnelly. Los sacerdotes activos de la diócesis y unos sacerdotes retirados estarán presentes en la reunión. Se quedará un sacerdote aquí en Boise en caso de emergencias y se podrán comunicar con el a través de la oficina parroquial.

En los años pasados los sacerdotes han trabajado en temas relacionadas con el sentido de ánimo y las condiciones psicológicas del trabajo del sacerdote tomando en cuenta todo lo que les ha pasado a los sacerdotes los últimos años pasados. Para unos sacerdotes estos años han sido muy difíciles. La perdida de buenos amigos resultando en mas trabajo por causa de esta escasez, el escándalo que provocaron casos de jóvenes abusados por los sacerdotes resultando en una nueva forma de vivir para los sacerdotes, el desprestigio publico de los sacerdotes y el sacerdocio, el mal manejo de los escándalos por los obispos y lo que escondieron del publico, la tensión entre los obispos y los sacerdotes, el conservatismo de los nuevos sacerdotes – estos son unos de los asuntos que hemos tratado de enfrentar. Estos son los temas que estaremos estudiando en nuestra reunión de sacerdotes.

Por favor ténganos presentes en sus oraciones mientras estamos fuera y si es posible por favor hagan el esfuerzo de asistir toda o parte de la conferencia diocesana este fin de semana en la Universidad Estatal de Boise (BSU).

En la primera semana de octubre la Iglesia celebra la fiesta de algunos santos muy conocidos. El 1 de octubre celebramos a Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús. Nació en Francia, en 1873. A los 15 años ya era religiosa carmelita. Vivió enferma la mayor parte de su vida, pero ofreció sus sufrimientos por la salvación de los pecadores del mundo. Murió en 1897, a la edad de 25 años. Es patrona de las misiones y doctora de la Iglesia. Su cuerpo incorrupto se conserva en un sarcófago de cristal en la basílica de Ste-Therese en Lisieux, Francia, a donde acuden cientos de miles de peregrinos. Escribió la "Historia de un Alma" donde expone su doctrina sobre la infancia espiritual.

El 2 celebramos a los Santos Angeles Custodios, mejor conocidos como "Angel de la Guarda", fiesta decretada por el Papa Pablo V, en 1608. Son seres espirituales que contemplan el rostro de Dios y han sido creados para servir a Dios y proteger y guiar a las personas. Entre los hispanos existe una gran devoción hacia ellos. De niños aprendimos una oración para invocar su ayuda: "Santo Angel de mi Guarda, mi dulce compañía, no me desampares ni de noche ni de día". Por eso en casi todos los cuartos de los niños podemos ver una imagen de ellos.

El día 4 celebramos a San Francisco de Asís, uno de los santos más populares en el mundo por su amor a Cristo Crucificado, a la pobreza y a la naturaleza. Nació en el pueblo de Asís, en Italia, en 1181. Fundó la Orden de los Franciscanos, una de las Ordenes que trajeron la fe a México y a varios países latinoamericanos. Su única meta era llegar a ser como Cristo. En 1224, durante un éxtasis, se acercó más que nunca a su Señor y recibió sus estigmas. Por modestia y humildad permaneció diácono toda la vida y nunca quiso recibir las órdenes sacerdotales. Murió en 1226, a los 45 años de edad. Dos años después, fue canonizado por el Papa Gregorio IX. En 1939 fue proclamado patrono de Italia.

El día 7 celebramos la fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario, en recuerdo de la victoria que alcanzara la escuadra cristiana en contra de la flota turca, en el golfo de Lepanto, el 7 de octubre de 1571. El Papa San Pío V atribuyó esta victoria al Santo Rosario que los fieles rezaban mientras se desarrollaba la batalla. Es una advocación muy popular en nuestros países. Es la Patrona de Guatemala; y en México hay muchos santuarios dedicados a Ella. En su honor, octubre es llamado "el mes del rosario".

In the first week of October the Church celebrates the holy days of some very well-known saints. On October 1 we celebrate Saint Teresita of the Child Jesús. She was born in France in 1873. At the age of 15 she was already a religious Carmelite. She was sick most of her life, but she offered up her sufferings for the salvation of the sinners of the world. She died in 1897, at the age of 25 years. She is the patron saint of missions and a doctor of the Church. Her incorrupt body lies in a crystal sarcophagus in the basilica of St. Therese in Lisieux, France, which is visited by hundreds of thousands of pilgrims. She wrote the "History of a Soul" which explains her doctrine on spiritual infancy.

On October 2<sup>nd</sup> we celebrate the St. Angels of Custody, better known as "Guardian angels," feast days decreed by Pope Paul V, in 1608. They are spiritual beings that contemplate the face of God and have been created to serve God and to protect and to guide people. Hispanics are very devoted to them. As children we learned a prayer to invoke our guardian angel's help: "My Guardian Angel, my sweet companion, do not abandon me at night nor in the daytime". That's why in almost all the children's rooms we can find an image of them.

On the 4th we commemorate Saint Francis of Assisi, one of the most popular saints in the world for his love of Christ Crucified, of poverty and of nature. He was born in the town of Assisi, in Italy, in 1181. He founded the Order of Franciscans, one of the Orders that brought the faith to Mexico and to several Latin-American countries. His only goal was to become like Christ. In 1224, during an ecstasy, he became closer than ever to his Lord and received his stigma. In modesty and humility St. Francis remained a deacon his whole life and never wanted to receive the priestly orders. He died in 1226, at 45 years of age. Two years later, he was canonized by Pope Gregory IX. In 1939 he was proclaimed the patron saint of Italy.

On the 7th we celebrate the festival of Our Lady of Rosario, in memory of the victory of the Christians over the Turkish fleet in the gulf of Lepanto, on October 7, 1571. Pope St. Pious V attributed this victory to the Holy Rosary that the faithful were saying while the battle was developing. It is a very popular dedication in our countries. Mary is the patron saint of Guatemala; and in Mexico there are many sanctuaries devoted to Her. In her honor, October is called "the month of the rosary."
