From the Pastor:

For today's column I would like to reprint a letter all the priests received from the diocese.

"We are all aware of the national debate over immigration and how it failed miserably. As the Most Rev. Nicholas DiMarzio, Chairman of the Domestic Policy Committee for the USCCB, stated in his Labor Day Statement: "After this debate, we are a society more divided, a people more confused, and a nation unable to move forward on one of the most serious and complicated issues we face as a nation." Because of this, we, as the Catholic Church in Idaho, need to speak out loudly and clearly in solidarity on behalf of the immigrants/strangers who are now living in our state."

"The Catholic Church of the Diocese of Boise wishes to thwart a growing anti-immigrant attitude that grips our nation, our state, and even some in our church. With a unified voice, we can, hopefully, bring about a change of hearts and minds among those who may have an anti-immigrant attitude. Our bishop, the Most Rev. Michael Driscoll, has agreed to dedicate a special weekend when we as a church in Idaho will address the problems we face in immigration reform. Thus, we are asking that, on the weekend of October 13/14, every parish and station, united with Bishop Michael, celebrate at all the liturgies the theme: *Welcoming the Stranger Among Us: Let Them Come to the Table*. Bishop Michael will voice the message of this theme at St. John's Cathedral on that weekend. We ask that all parishes and stations join with him on that weekend by proclaiming the same message in support of the immigrants."

"The purpose of this weekend:

1) To help our people become better informed about the immigration problem in our country and the need to reform a system that is broken. 2) Share Catholic social teachings and moral principles, which must guide and shape our attitudes toward the immigrants. 3) Develop a spirit of hospitality in our parish communities and welcome the immigrant/stranger at our table." This is a most important issue for us here at St. Mary's. May God bless our efforts.

"Estamos enterados del debate nacional sobre la inmigración y cómo ha fallado rotundamente. Como el Excelentísimo Obispo Nicholas DiMarzio, Líder del Comité de Normas Domésticas para el USCCB comentó en el discurso titulado "Labor Day Statement", "Después de este debate, somos una sociedad más dividida, somos un pueblo más confuso, y una nación que no puede salir adelante cuando tratando este tema tan serio y complicado que enfrentamos como una nación." Con una voz unida, esperamos, que nosotros podamos lograr un cambio de corazones y mentalidades dentro de los que tienen una mala actitud sobre la inmigración. Nuestro obispo el Excelentísimo Michael Driscoll, ha acordado dedicar un fin de semana especial para que como una iglesia unida en Idaho podamos tratar los problemas que enfrentamos por falta de una reforma de inmigración. Por eso les pedimos que en el fin de semana del 13 y 14 de octubre, cada parroquia, unidos con el Obispo Michael, celebremos todas las liturgias con el tema: "Dando la bienvenida al extranjero que se encuentra entre nosotros: Déjenlos que vengan a la Mesa." El Obispo Michael va a dar su mensaje con este tema en la Catedral de San Juan ese mismo fin de semana. Les pedimos a todas la parroquias que lo acompañen ese fin de semana para proclamar el mismo mensaje apoyando a los inmigrantes.

El propósito de este fin de semana es:

1) Ayudar a la gente estar mejor informados sobre el problema de la inmigración en nuestro país y la necesidad que hay de reformar un sistema que esta descompuesto. 2) Compartir las enseñanzas católicas y principios morales que deben guiar y formar nuestras actitudes sobre los inmigrantes. 3) Desarrollar un espíritu de hospitalidad

El Día de la Raza celebra la herencia hispana/Latina de América Latina y las influencias étnicas y culturales que la identifican. La fecha es el 12 de octubre en Argentina, Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Honduras, México, Uruguay y Venezuela. Al respecto, quiero compartir una anécdota seguida de una reflexión. Dos ingenieros estaban reunidos en una oficina en Quito, Ecuador, Emilio, un ecuatoriano que estaba diseñando un puente, y Todd, un consultor visitante de los Estados Unidos. Terminada la reunión, Emilio preguntó: "¿En qué fecha de octubre puedes regresar?" Todd revisó su calendario y dijo: "¿Qué te parece el Día de Colón?" "¿Qué es el Día de Colón?" "El día que Colón descubrió América. ¿Acaso no lo celebran ustedes?". Nosotros celebramos el 12 de octubre como "Día de la Raza"; que hace referencia a la nueva raza que resultó de la mezcla de los pueblos de Europa y de las Américas. Ese día celebramos nuestro mestizaje étnico y cultural. De hecho, en algunas partes se le llama "Día de las Culturas". "¡Qué diferente!", pensó Todd. "Nuestra fiesta en Norteamérica se enfoca en celebrar sólo un día, el 12 de octubre de 1492; mientras que la de ustedes celebra los 515 años de desarrollo cultural". "Tienes razón, dijo Emilio, ustedes quieren destacar el logro de un hombre europeo; en cambio nosotros honramos la contribución de cada grupo étnico a lo que llamamos ahora cultura latina o hispana". Emilio y Todd estaban diseñando la construcción de un puente. ¿Cómo podríamos nosotros construir puentes para unir culturas? En el primer siglo de cristianismo, san Pablo nos aconsejó usar el puente diseñado por Dios, el Ingeniero de nuestra Salvación. Ese puente es Cristo, cuyo "propósito fue crear de las dos partes un solo hombre (o cultura) nuevo. Así hizo la paz. El puso fin, en sí mismo, a la enemistad que existía entre los dos pueblos y con su muerte en la cruz los reconcilió con Dios, haciendo de ellos un solo cuerpo... Por eso, ustedes ya no son extranjeros, ya no están fuera de su tierra, sino que ahora comparten con el pueblo santo los mismos derechos y son miembros de la familia de Dios. Ustedes son como un edificio levantado sobre los fundamentos de los apóstoles y los profetas; y Jesucristo mismo es la piedra angular." Día de la Raza is the celebration of the Hispanic/Latino heritage of Latin America and brings into it all the ethnic and cultural influences making it distinctive. It is celebrated on October 12 in Argentina, Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Honduras, México, Uruguay and Venezuela. I would like to share with you a story and the accompanying reflection. Two engineers were working in an office in Quito, Ecuador. Emilio, an Ecuadorian, was designing a bridge. Todd was a visiting consultant from the United States. As their meeting concluded, Emilio asked, "When can you return in October?" Todd checked his calendar and said, "How about Columbus Day?" "What is Columbus Day?" "The day Columbus discovered America. Don't you celebrate it here?" We observe October 12th as a holiday, but we call it "Día de la Raza," which means Day of the Race. "So people run a big race on Columbus Day?" Todd guessed. Emilio laughed. "No, Day of the Race refers to the new race of people that developed out of the meeting of the American and European peoples. On that day we celebrate our mixed ethnic and cultural heritage. In fact, some people even call it "Day of the Cultures. "How different!, Todd mused. "Our holiday in North America focuses on a single day, October 12, 1492, while your holiday focuses on 515 years of cultural development." "In North America," Emilio added, "you stress the accomplishment of one European man, and here we honor the contribution of each ethnic group to our Latino culture." Emilio and Todd were designing a bridge. How shall we build bridges between cultures? In the first century, saint Paul advised us to use the bridge designed by God, the Engineer of our Salvation. That bridge is Christ, whose "purpose was to create in himself one new man (or culture) out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility... Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ himself as cornerstone' (Eph 2: 15b-16. 19-20) (Source: Phil Bickel, Weekly Bible study/devotional column).

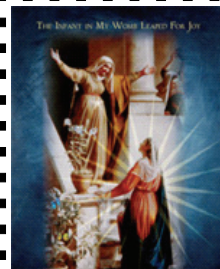
