From the Pastor,

The next few months are going to be very busy here at Saint Mary's. This weekend we will have a speaker at all the Masses talking about the "Adopt a Student Program" for St. Mary's School, and we will be urging the parish to get tickets for the big dinner and dance on November 19th. On one of the upcoming weekends we will be publically accepting a check from the Creegan Foundation to help subsidize the school.

Toward the end of the month we will begin our fund drive for the last money we need for the renovation of the church. We will be asking those who have already pledged to increase the size of their pledge and extend their pledge for two more years. We will be asking those who did not pledge two years ago or who were not here two years ago to make pledges now. And we will be seeking out the members of the old Saint Mary's families throughout Boise, and elsewhere to make a donation in honor and memory of their families. For that part of the drive we will need people with good memories to come forward and help.

During November we will begin to get ready for the move. The old rectory, the office building, has to be moved out. We have a couple of people who have expressed interest in buying the building and moving it, but we will soon advertise it. Then we will begin to set up our temporary offices and start moving things out of the rectory so it can be moved. With all the priests who have lived there and worked there, we know that the amount of "stuff" in that building is enormous. All that has to be gone through and much of it saved.

We have a very special Advent program called "Advent Saint Mary's 2006, Celebrating Our Past and Our Future." Elsewhere in the bulletin is a list of the special Masses and events throughout December when we can remember the sacraments and special moments that have taken place in the old church. We have asked priests who have served at Saint Mary's to come back and remember with us.

Then in January we will move to Madison School for Sunday Mass and a whole new era will begin. This is a busy time and not an easy time, but God will continue to guide us.

El Día de la Raza es la celebración de nuestra identidad y herencia multicultural y multiétnica que nos distingue de otros países. Lo celebramos el 12 de octubre en Argentina, Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Honduras, México, Uruguay y Venezuela. En el siglo XV, un marino llamado Cristóbal Colón pensaba que había encontrado una ruta más corta para llegar a la India. Le tomó ocho años convencer a la Reina Isabel de España para que costeara el viaje. Se lanzó a tal empresa con tres embarcaciones: La Niña, La Pinta y La Santa María. El 12 de octubre de 1492 desembarcó en una isla de las Bahamas, creyendo que había llegado a la India. Treinta años después, Hernán Cortés conquistó México, que se convirtió en colonia de España por 300 años. Los españoles trajeron consigo misioneros que, algunos de ellos, quedaron muy impresionados de lo avanzado de las culturas indígenas. Aunque los españoles impusieron su gobierno y su religión, se casaron con mujeres indígenas y muchas tradiciones sobrevivieron la conquista. Resultado de ello, nuestra nación es ahora una mezcla de esas dos razas: por eso hablamos de una nueva raza, a la que llamamos mestiza. Esto es lo que celebramos cada 12 de octubre: el Día de la Raza.

Día de la Raza is the celebration of Hispanic heritage of Latin América and brings into it all the ethnic and cultural influences making it distinctive. It is celebrated on October 12 in Argentina, Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Honduras, México, Uruguay and Venezuela. In the 15th century, an Italian sailor named Christopher Columbus thought he had found a new and shorter route to India. It took him eight years to convince Queen Isabella of Spain to pay for his journey. He left with three small ships: La Niña, La Pinta, and La Santa María. And, on October 12th, 1492, he landed on an island in the Bahamas, thinking he was in India. Thirty years later, México was conquered by Hernán Cortés and became a colony of Spain for the next 300 years. The Spanish conquistadors brought missionaries with them, some of whom were very impressed by the local cultures. Although Spain imposed its government and religion, the people intermarried and many native traditions survived. Our nation today is a mixture of the Spanish and the indigenous. We call that new race and that new culture mestizo, that is what we celebrate on October 12th, Día de la Raza.
