### PASTORS' PAGE

From the Pastor,

Events in the past few months have led us to make a major change in our building plans. For three years we have been working with the Nazarene Church on Castle Drive to have a "turnkey" operation where we would buy land from them and build them a new church. When that would be completed the two churches would trade the two properties and we would own the building and 9 acres on Castle Drive. That was to be the site for a new Saint Mary's School. We set a two million dollar cap on how much we could afford to do this.

We did buy land on Bogart Lane and we did have church plans drawn up for this project. But in the end the costs of construction rose to the point where our cap was exceeded. We have made the decision not to continue with this plan.

We now have worked out a new plan for the new school. We intend to build the new school on our existing property on State Street. We will build a new building approximately the size of the existing school where the Parish Center (the old convent) is. We will use part of the old school as a new parish hall, food bank, and adult classrooms. The top floor of the old school and the new building will be the new Saint Mary's School.

This also gives us the opportunity to sell the land we bought for the Nazarene Church. This includes the land on Bogart Lane and the small "Stone House" farm next to the Nazarene Church.

While many people, including me, were excited and pleased about the possibility of a new school on Castle Drive, there were also people who never wanted the church and school at different places. Now they will be on the same site.

God continues to guide us in our plans and this new change I am sure will work out for the best.

We will continue to have a fund drive in October and November for the church renovation and will begin construction in January.

Esta semana celebramos el 16 de septiembre, fecha que marca el comienzo de la sangrienta lucha de independencia de México por liberarse de España, en 1810. En la madrugada del 16 de septiembre de 1810, el Señor Cura Don Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, párroco de Dolores, hizo una gigantesca decisión que revolucionó el curso de la historia de México: tocó las campanas, como acostumbraba para llamar a Misa. Pero en esa ocasión invitó a la gente a liberarse del yugo de los "gachupines" (despectivo de españoles) que los habían explotado y oprimido por 10 generaciones. Es lo que conocemos como "El Grito de Dolores", que ha significado desde entonces un llamado a la libertad, y a la igualdad para los menos favorecidos de la sociedad, hasta el día de hoy. La fiesta del 16 de septiembre ocupa un lugar muy importante en las celebraciones de los mexicanos. Comienza desde el 15, poco antes de la medianoche y es celebrada en cada ciudad y pueblo de México. En la capital, el Presidente de la República, siguiendo el ritual, toca la histórica campana de la libertad, la misma que tocó Don Miguel Hidalgo. Entonces da "El Grito": "Mexicanos, ¡Viva México! y la gente responde lo mismo, con todo el entusiasmo y potencia de su voz. El Grito incluye vivas a los héroes que nos dieron patria y libertad: "Vivan los Héroes de nuestra Independencia!" Una vez terminado el grito, el Presidente ondea la bandera tricolor, toca la campana y se canta el Himno Nacional. Al siguiente día hay festejos cívicos que incluyen un desfile militar, charreadas, jaripeos y corridas de toros. Fuera de México, en las ciudades con numerosa presencia mexicana, el cónsul mexicano da el Grito. Aquí en Boise, los organizadores me invitan a hacerlo; lo cual es un gran honor que me conceden. Muchas gracias y ¡Viva México!

Soon 16 de septiembre will be celebrated. It marks the start of the bloody Mexican War of Independence fought against Spain in 1810. Shortly before dawn on September 16, 1810, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla (a Catholic priest assigned to the town of Dolores) made a momentous decision that revolutionized the course of Mexican history. Fr. Miguel Hidalgo rang the church bells as he customarily did to call the people (mostly "Indians") to Mass. The message that Hidalgo gave to the Indians and mestizos called them to get free from the gachupines or native Spaniards who had exploited and oppressed Mexicans for ten generations. The "Grito de Dolores" sparked a vision of a world of liberty, equality, and freedom from want for the downtrodden unattainable until today.

The Mexican Independence Day is a major holiday in México. The celebration begins every September 15th at 11 pm in every single city and town in México. In México city, the President, following the ritual, rings the historic liberty bell that Father Hidalgo rang to call the people. Then he gives the "El Grito" (The Cry). He shouts "Mexicanos, Viva México" and the crowd echoes back, establishing the tradition which has been solemnly followed every year thereafter. And it is echoed by the governor of each state throughout the country. The Cry may include other acclamations, such as the one included by President Benito Juárez to honor all those who sacrificed to make México free: "Long live the Heroes of our independence". After the last "Viva México" is cried, the president waves the flag, rings the bell, and the National Anthem is sung. The next day, there is a civic ceremony, and a military parade. There are rodeos, parades, bullfights and horseback rider performances. In cities with large Mexican communities outside of México, the Mexican Consul does the traditional "Grito". In the city of Boise's celebration of "El Grito", the organizers invite me to do it, which is a great honor. Thank you very much and ¡Viva México!

"At this Mass, parents of children with disabilities need not be embarrassed by the sometimes uncontrollable behavior of their child," said Father Schumacher. "At this Mass, the behavior is understood by all. We all simply take delight in their presence."
