Después de tres siglos, la madrugada del 16 de septiembre de 1810, un sacerdote católico, el señor cura don Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla dio el "Grito" de Independencia. Llamó a todos los mexicanos a luchar por su independencia. Después de largos y sangrientos 11 años de lucha, México logró su independencia el 27 de septiembre de 1821. Una de las características de la lucha por la independencia en México fue la participación de los sacerdotes. Se habla de la participación directa de 145 sacerdotes católicos, entre los que destacan: Miguel Hidalgo, José María Morelos y Mariano Matamoros. September 16th: the 199th anniversary of the beginning of Mexico's Independence. The colony began with the fall of the Great Tenochtitlan, capitol of the Aztec empire (August 13, 1521); in other words, Mexico was governed by Spain. After three centuries, on the dawn of September 16th, 1810, a Catholic Priest, Father Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla gave the "Grito" Cry of Independence. He called all of the Mexicans to fight for their independence. After eleven years of a long and bloody battle, Mexico accomplished its independence on the 27th of September in 1821. One of the characteristics of the battle for independence in Mexico was the participation of priests. It is said that there was direct participation of 145 Catholic Priests and among those highlighted are: Miguel Hidalgo, José María Morelos y Mariano Matamoros. Congratulations to all who are of Mexican origin. Happy Independence Day Mexico!
