Esta semana se celebra la fiesta de Independencia en varios países de América Latina. ¡Felicidades! Voy a hablar un poco de la fiesta de la Iniciación de la lucha por la Independencia de México, que se conoce como "El Grito de Independencia" y se celebra el 16 de septiembre. La idea de la independencia de México fue alentada por las ideas liberales francesas, por el ejemplo de la Independencia de los Estados Unidos y porque se tenía conciencia de que España pasaba por serios problemas financieros y militares. Además, la situación política, económica y social de la Nueva España era ya insostenible. Todo esto se conjugó para que se iniciaran las juntas de conspiradores contra la corona española. La más importante fue la de Querétaro, en la que participaban, entre otros, don Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla (sacerdote), Ignacio Allende, Ignacio Aldama y Mariano Jiménez. Habiendo sido descubierta la conspiración, Hidalgo decidió, en la madrugada del 16 de septiembre de 1810, iniciar el Movimiento de Independencia, lanzando a repique las campanas de la iglesia de la parroquia de Dolores, donde Hidalgo era el párroco. Al pasar por el pueblo de Atotonilco, Hidalgo tomó el estandarte de la Virgen de Guadalupe como bandera de la lucha por la independencia. Después de la muerte de Hidalgo, otro sacerdote se puso al frente de los insurgentes, don José María Morelos y Pavón. Después de 11 años y 11 días de lucha, se consumó la Independencia de México, el 27 de septiembre de 1821. Un saludo a todas las personas originarias de México y mis felicitaciones por la celebración del Día de su Independencia. ¡Viva México!

This week various Latin American countries celebrate the feast of their independence. Congratulations! Today I'll be talking a little about how the battle for independence began for Mexico, which is known as "El Grito de Independencia," or "The Cry for Independence" and it is celebrated on September 16. Mexico's Independence movement was encouraged by the ideas of the French Liberals, by the example of the United States Independence and also because it was known that Spain was having some serious financial and military problems. Additionally, the political, economic and social situation in the New Spain was untenable. All of this combined initiated the gathering of plotters who planned a revolt against the Spanish colonial government. The most important gathering was the one in the town of Queretaro where there was participation from the following, among others: Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla (priest), Ignacio Allende, Ignacio Aldama and Mariano Jimenez. When the plotters were betrayed and discovered, Hidalgo decided, just before dawn on September 16, 1810 to initiate the independence movement by ringing the church bells of the church in Dolores where Hidalgo was the parish pastor. As Hidalgo passed by the town of Atotonilco, he took the banner of Our Lady of Guadalupe and it became the banner of the revolutionary forces as they fought for independence. After the death of Hidalgo, another priest put himself before the insurgents, Jose Maria Morelos and Pavon. After 11 years and 11 days of war, Mexico finally gained its freedom on September 27, 1821. Greetings to all who originated from Mexico and congratulations on the celebration of the Day of your Independence. Viva Mexico!
