Finally I thank all of those who are buying lottery tickets every week for the parish, including the Idaho lottery, the Powerball, and even the Irish Lottery. If that is the way God wants us to get the money, that will be fine with me.

Entre mis santos preferidos san Francisco de Asís ocupa un lugar muy importante. La Iglesia celebra su fiesta el 4 de octubre. Me atraen sobre todo su amor a Cristo Crucificado, a la Iglesia, a la pobreza y a la Creación. Quiero compartir con ustedes algunos detalles de su vida. Nació en Asís, Italia, en 1182. Su madre se llamaba Pica y su padre Pedro Bernardone, un hombre admirador de Francia, por lo cual puso a su hijo el nombre de Francisco que significa "el pequeño francesito". Cuando joven, a Francisco le gustaba asistir a fiestas, paseos y reuniones con mucha música. Su padre tenía uno de los mejores almacenes de ropa en la ciudad; así que al joven Francisco le sobraba el dinero. Después de una juventud disipada en diversiones se convirtió, renunció a los bienes paternos y se entregó de lleno a Dios. Francisco era un verdadero poeta y le encantaba recorrer los campos cantando bellas canciones; compuso un himno a las criaturas, en el cual alaba a Dios por el sol y la luna, la tierra y las estrellas, el fuego y el viento,

el agua y la vegetación. Su saludo era "Paz y Bien". Fue el inventor del pesebre viviente. Fue en 1223 cuando hizo la primera representación del nacimiento del Niño Dios, rodeado de animales y otras figuras vivientes. Es el fundador de la Orden de los Frailes Menores (OFM) conocidos como los franciscanos; que son el grupo religioso más numeroso que existe en la Iglesia Católica. El 3 de octubre de 1226, acostado en el duro suelo, cubierto con un hábito que le habían prestado de limosna y pidiendo a sus seguidores que se amaran siempre como Cristo los había amado, murió como había vivido: lleno de alegría, de paz y de amor a Dios. Apenas dos años después de su muerte fue declarado santo. Ciertamente no existe ningún santo que sea tan popular como él tanto entre los católicos como entre los protestantes y aun entre los no cristianos. Es un santo para todos. Terminó con una cita del Papa Juan Pablo II: "El hombre de hoy necesita la fe, la esperanza y la caridad de Francisco; necesita la alegría que brota de la pobreza de espíritu; esto es, de una liberación interior".

El mismo día 4 también celebramos el cumpleaños de nuestro querido párroco, el Padre W. Thomas Faucher. Desde estas líneas le mando un fuerte abrazo de felicitación, de amistad y de admiración por todo lo que él significa para mí en lo personal, para nuestra comunidad parroquial, para la diócesis de Boise y para muchas personas más. Que Dios lo siga llenando de sus bendiciones. ¡Felicidades, Padre Tom! ¡Muchos días de éstos! ¡Ad multos annos vivas!

Among my favorite saints, St. Francis of Assisi holds an important place. The church celebrates his feast day on October 4. Some of the things that attract me most are his love of the Crucified Christ, the church, the poor and creation. I want to share with you some details of his life. He was born in Assisi, Italy in 1182. His mother's name was Pica and his father's name was Pedro Bernardone, a man admired in France that is why he named his son Francesco. This means "little French one". When he was young, Francis enjoyed attending parties, traveling and gatherings with lots of music. His father had one of the best clothes warehouses in the city; so young Francis had lots of money to spare. After a youth of dissipated entertainment he converted, renounced his paternal wealth and he became totally devoted to God. Francis was truly a poet and he loved to run through nature singing beautiful songs; he composed a hymn of creation, in which he worshiped God through the sun and the moon, earth and stars, fire, wind, water and vegetation. His greeting was "Peace and Well". He was the inventor of the living manger. It was in 1223 when he made the first representation of the nativity of Baby Jesus, surrounded by animals and other living figures. He is the founder of the Order of Friar Minors (OFM) known as the Franciscans; which is the largest religious group existing in the Catholic Church. On October 3, 1226, while lying on a hard floor, covered with a borrowed cloth given by charity and asking his followers to always love like God loved them, he died like he lived: Full of joy, peace and love of God. It was only two years after his death that he was named a saint. Certainly there is no other saint in existence who is as popular as he is among Catholics, Protestants and even non Christians. He is a saint for everyone. I'll conclude with a quote from Pope John Paul II: "Today's human needs the faith, hope and charity of Francis; needs joy that grows from spiritual poverty; this is an internal freedom".

Also on the 4th of October we celebrate our dear Pastor's birthday, Fr. W. Thomas Faucher. This message is extend a congratulatory hug for your birthday, for your friendship and admiration, for all that you signify to me personally, to our parish community, to the diocese of Boise and to many other people. May God continue to fill you with many blessings. Congratulations, Fr. Tom! Many happy returns! Ad multos annos vivas!
