There are a number of things I want to mention this week.

First of all as I mentioned at most of the English Language Masses last weekend, Father John Cunningham died suddenly last week. He had gone to dinner with the other priests in Bend, Oregon, but the next morning was found dead in his bed. He took my place and Father Camacho's place this past year. He was a close friend of mine and I will miss him very much. Please keep him and all of the priests who had died in your prayers.

I continue to work on the new statutes for the new Saint Mary's School Governing Board. I have received many, many comments on the draft document and many suggested changes. I will consider these this week. What will happen next is the naming of the first Board Members to the new board and then a couple of months during which they will meet and finalize some of the difficult points. Then they will go through some professional training in how to be a board and finally be constituted as the new School Governing Board sometime in the late fall.

Last Sunday I invited Father John Donoghue to celebrate the 8:30 Mass. Father Donoghue will be asked to do some of the Masses here at Saint Mary's this fall and winter. He misses the chance to have Mass on Sunday with a congregation. Father Donoghue was the associate pastor here at Saint Mary's when I was a child, then he was my pastor at Sacred Heart when I was associate there in the 1970's. He was the first Director of Nazareth and then was pastor at Saint Mark's for many years. Even after his retirement he was elected Administrator of the Diocese between Bishops Brown and Driscoll. It is always an honor to have him here at Saint Mary's.
